Physical Efficiency Test (PET) is mandatory for admission in B.P.Ed. and M.P.Edprogrammes. PET for B.P.Ed.programme will be conducted on 17.06.2023 at 09:00 a.m. and for M.P.Ed. programme on 20.06.2023 at 09:00 a.m. in the Dept. of Physical Education, KUK. The schedule and respective groups of PET will be notified on or before 16.06.2023 on the Admission Portal of KUK. The candidates should come in a proper sports kit and bring print out of their admission form and original ID proofs (Aadhar Card/Driving Licence/PAN Card/Voter Card etc.) at the time of PET. The candidates, who will qualify the PET, will be allowed to appear in the Entrance Test.

SCHEDULE AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR M.A. MUSIC (VOCAL & INSTRUMENTAL) PROGRAMME

Admission for the programme will be made on the basis of merit determined by composite marks of the candidates in the Entrance Test (80 Marks) and Performance based Practical Examination of 20 minutes duration for each candidate (20 Marks). Performance based Practical Examination (Basic Knowledge of Swar, Lay, Taal & Raag) for admission in M.A. Music (Vocal & Instrumental) programme will be conducted from 01.07.2023 to 07.07.2023. 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Kurukshetra University is a premier institution of higher learning in India. Established in 1956 as a Sanskrit University, presently it offers education and research programmes in diverse areas of science, engineering and technology, business studies, humanities, social sciences, performing arts and sports. Located on the Western bank of famed Brahm Sarovar, the University has a sprawling green campus spread over 473 acres. Over the past 66 years, Kurukshetra University has grown in stature and recognition of its commitment to excellence in teaching and research. The University is continuously building on its reputation as an A + grade institution accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with a score of 3.52. Retaining its position among the top ranking institutions of the country, the University has been placed at 8th position among the state universities in the Category-I by the Ministry of Education and has been awarded academic autonomy. Highly experienced and qualified faculty members, which form the backbone of the University, continuously engage in the maintenance and enhancement of student-centric learning environment through innovative pedagogy.

With a view to impart education as per National Education Policy -2020, KU has introduced NEP based curriculum in all its on-campus undergraduate programmes from the session 2022-23. It will enhance the knowledge, employability, skills and cultural and ethical values of our students. The University offers 172 programs on the campus in 49 Departments/Institutes through a highly qualified faculty. The University also has 291 affiliated colleges and institutes in 8 districts of Haryana.

One measure of our reputation is the high quality of research produced in traditional and modern disciplines over the last seven decades of our existence. The University has two National research facilities: Ion Beam Centre and Low Temperature Thermochronology Centre. Five more research centres are coming up in cutting-edge research areas. Six training centers are working in which a large number of students have been trained in various skills, entrepreneurship and incubation of new ideas till date. In sports and cultural achievements, Kurukshetra University is the leading institution in the country. In MAKA trophy, for which about 910 Universities participates in various Inter University sports competitions, KU is at number 3 in 2021-22. KU has achieved an important position in Khelo India University Games by bringing 39 medals and coming on 7th rank in the country.

The University offers a number of facilities to its students which include 13 on-campus hostels for girls and 12 for boys, a central library, air-conditioned reading space for 1300 students, smart class rooms, online web-resources, video conferencing room, language labs, auditorium, health centre, shopping complex, banks, post-office and world-class sports and cultural activities facilities.

1.2 STRIVING FOR EXCELLENCE

Kurukshetra University is widely recognized for its commitment towards imparting quality education and excellent research. The University has also proved its excellence in sports at National level and presence at International level. The University has been accredited with A+ grade in cycle-III by NAAC after assessing its progress towards academic excellence in the form of Curricular Aspects; Teaching-Learning and Evaluation; Research, Consultancy and Extension; Infrastructure and Learning Resources; Students' Support and Progression; Governance, Leadership and Management; Innovations and Best Practices.

University benchmarks its academic content consistently to the best in the country and has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)-Learning Outcomes Curriculum Framework (LOCF) based curricula w.e.f. the session 2020-21 followed by the adoption of NEP in UG and select PG programmes w.e.f. the session 2022-23.

University fulfills its purpose of creation of knowledge by encouraging quality research through a system of rewards and support system. Organization of conferences/workshops/seminars is a regular activity on the campus to encourage debates and discussions and inculcate a spirit of inquity among its faculty.

University is one of the 25 Universities of the Country graded as Category-I University by UGC and one of the first 10 State Universities of India selected by MHRD for funding under RUSA worth Rs. 100 crore. Under this scheme 5 Research Centres i.e., (i) Centre for Advance Material Research (CAMR); (ii) Centre for IT and Automation; (iii) Centre for Applied Biology in Environment Sciences (CABES); (iv) Centre for Advance Research in Earthquake Studies (CARES) and (v) Centre of Excellence for Research on the Saraswati River (CERSR) and six Training Centre i.e., (i) Incubation Centre; (ii) Centre for Skill Development; (iii) Centre for Entrepreneurship; (iv) Corporate Resource Centre; (v) Centre for Continuing Education and (vi) Centre for Sports have been created with a vision to promote Research, Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Employability.

In order to ensure good governance with focus on speed, accuracy and efficiency, an Integrated University Management System (IUMS) is being implemented in the University to fully automate Student Life Cycle. University is making forward moves for online education, dual degrees, offline/online/blend of education and skilling of students.

1.3 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the University was established in 1995 and since then working towards the realization of the goals of Quality enhancement and sustenance. The IQAC has been functioning under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor with representation from faculty, administration, students, alumni and external experts as its members. It continuously strives to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the University. For this purpose, a policy for Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) of the University has been framed and implemented. The aim is to channelize all efforts and measures of the University towards promoting 'Quality Culture' leading to holistic academic excellence. This is achieved through involvement of students, teachers, administrative staff and other stakeholders including alumni and employers. The IQAC has been actively involved in the issues related to curricular aspects, teaching learning and evaluation, research/consultancy, students support and progression, examination reforms etc. The IQAC is involved in monitoring the teaching-learning process through students feedback system which has been collected, analyzed and discussed in the academic bodies of the University. It submits Annual Quality Assurance Report (AOAR) of the University to NAAC. It collects and complies the data of the University for participating in ranking survey including NIRF. IQAC has strengthened the feedback system in the revision of syllabi of different programmes.

1.4 UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The JLN Library established on 11th January, 1957, is located at a central place in the middle of various Departments and Institutes of the Kurukshetra University. The Library has a total plinth area of 1,14,205 sq. feet besides beautiful well maintained lush green parks and vehicles parking. The JLN Library comprises of three blocks i.e. Ranganathan Block, Ram Prasad Bismil Golden Jubilee Reading Hall and Savitri Bai Phule Block having seating capacity of 1750. Presently, the library has a well maintained rich collection of 4,09,405 Books (including Bound volumes and Ph.D. Thesis), 15,324 Manuscripts and 8000+ e-Journals covering all the subjects of different disciplines. Presently the library is receiving 14 full text E-Resources under E-shodh Sindhu consortium of INFLIBNET. The JLN Library has subscription of other E-Resources like SciFinder, Emerald, Manupartra, SSC Online, Pro Quest and Elsevier. The JLN Library also provides plagiarism detection services with the help of Turnitin and Urkund softwares. Besides this, Assistive

Technology Lab has been established in JLN Library for visual impaired students. The JLN Library has also implemented the IUMS software for providing library service to students.

The JLN Library comprises of various sections such as Registration, Periodical, Internet Services Centre, Technical, Acquisition, Reference and provides open access to its books and periodicals' collection. The buildings are centrally air conditioned and with all modern amenities for the reading of the students which remain open 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 midnight on all the days throughout the year (except on 26th January, 15th August and 2nd October, 1st November and Holi). The Circulation (books issue and return) and Internet facility is available from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. from Monday to Saturday. One Reading Hall in Savitri Bai Phule Block with a seating capacity of 120 students remains open round the clock. The JLN Library provides a congenial atmosphere to the enrolled students for reading and preparation of their university examinations and competitive examinations. The library is equipped with modern infrastructure, generator facility, internet and provides disturbance free atmosphere to the students with adequate security arrangements. The library has dedicated reading section for Ph.D. Scholars with adequate facilities.

Internet Services Centre of the library was established in 1996 to keep abreast with the latest information technology and new trends in information management and services. The link of Library on University website www.kuk.ac.in acts as a single window information provider for the access of all its resources and services. The JLN library offers various automated/computerized activities and services including access to E-Resources (Remote Access), CD-ROMs, circulation services and Web-OPAC etc.

1.5 STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICES

1.5.1 Office of the Dean Students' Welfare

A number of facilities and opportunities are provided to the students of the University by the office of the Dean Students' Welfare. The office governs all Cultural, Sports, NSS and Youth Red Cross activities of the University Teaching Departments and Institutes on the Campus. The office maintains liaison with students regarding their demands and other welfare activities.

Bus and train passes are issued through this office. Educational/study tours are also organized through this office. The office provides generous supports for extension lectures and other students' programmes of importance. The office provides financial help to the Differently Abled students for transportation facilities on Campus and provides Jackets/Jerseys to the SC/ST students. The office also supports the needy students through the Earn While You Learn Scheme which enables students to do some work in their Departments/Institutes on a token payment basis. Insurance of all the students of the University Teaching Departments on the Campus in the form of Group Insurance Scheme is managed by the Dean Students' Welfare office.

The office provides support to the students of University Teaching Departments for participating in cultural and literary events like Zonal Youth Festival, Inter-Zonal Youth Festival, Haryana Day Festival (Ratnawali), Annual Public Speaking Competition (ROSTRUM) and other Quiz, Declamation, Paper-reading, Poster Making, Music and Dramatic Competitions: Slogan Writing Competition, Essay Writing Competitions etc. ROSTRUM is a programme initiated by the Dean Students' Welfare office to develop communication abilities among students. The competition (ROSTRUM) is very popular and attracts thousands of students every year for participation.

Sports material is provided to the students for sports activities on the Campus and the office provides support to students of University Teaching Departments for participating in sports tournaments held at Zonal and Inter-Zonal level of the University.

Dean Students' Welfare convenes the meeting of the Students' Grievances Redressal Cell which looks after the grievances or the students which can be submitted to the Dean Students' Welfare either through an email (dsw@kuk.ac.in) or in writing.

The office of the Dean Students' Welfare organizes students' programme for making the students aware regarding their role in the society. The office also takes measures from time to time to inculcate leadership qualities amongst students. The office organizes and promote activities under the national programmes like 'Aatamnirbhar Bharat', Swachh Bharat, Jal Sanrakshan and other Environmental Awareness programmes through club. The programmes for development of communication skills, soft skills, personality development and enhancement of placement activities on campus are also managed through the office of the Dean Students' Welfare.

1.5.2 Supporting International Students

In the age of globalization, Kurukshetra University has set out to make its presence felt globally through internationalization of its programmes and opening new avenues of association for global student community. In order to assist international students, the University has an International Students' Office who helps the international students to understand the admission procedures of various university programmes, getting VISA for admissions and also to help them to integrate with and live comfortably in the new environment. This office was established in the year 1981. Now total 172 international students from 31 different countries are studying in the University Campus in UG/PG/Ph.D. courses. In the session 2022-23, 78 international students from 19 different countries have taken admission in the University. All these students are studying in the 10 out of total 11 faculties present in the University. These students have taken admission in 26 different departments/institutes under more than 50 programmes running in KUK. All these international students got admission through Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), New Delhi scholarship, a Govt. of India scholarship. ICCR is an autonomous organization of the Govt. of India, involved in India's global cultural relations, through cultural exchange with other countries and their people. More than 40 international students in the last session 2022-23, who completed their UG/PG programme at University Campus will get their degrees. The details of admission can be downloaded from the University website.

1.6 DR. RADHAKRISHNAN FOUNDATION FUND

Dr. Radhakrishnan Foundation Fund was established in the year 1994 for raising donations/ mobilization of resources etc. for the overall development of the University under Financial Resources Mobilization (FRM) services of the University Grants Commission. The annual interest accrued to the fund is utilized for award of scholarship etc. to the students. 100+40 scholarships on the merit-cum-means and BPL card holder @Rs. 750/- p.m. are awarded to the students of under-graduate classes studying in UTDs/Institutes/Institute of Integrated and Honours Studies. 200+40 scholarships on the merit-cum-means and BPL card holder @Rs.1000/- p.m. are awarded to the students of post-graduate classes studying in UTDs.

1.7 ON-CAMPUS HOSTEL FACILITIES

The University at present has 25 Hostels (11 for Boys, 1 for Foreign male students and 13 for Girl students) on the campus. These hostels have a capacity to accommodate 2764 boys and 3454 girls respectively. Providing a comfortable and safe atmosphere to the students, the hostel facilities on the campus make it easy for the students to find a home like accommodation away from their families. The girls' hostels provide all important facilities within the girls' hostels complex. These include Common Gym, Common Reading Hall, ATM, Photocopy facilities, Computer Lab. etc. Special pavement and washroom facilities are generated for Divyang Students. Out of 25 hostels, 15 hostels operate their own mess and in rest of the hostels there are contractual messes where hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu is provided keeping in view of the large number of applicants seeking hostel accommodation, the University allots hostels to the students on the basis of their merit in the admission list. Most of the hostels have Reading Rooms, Computer Lab., Common Rooms and Indoor & Outdoor Games facilities. The University has also made available the facility to male hostlers for parking their vehicles in the Central Parking near their hostels. The girls' hostels also

provide round the clock Ambulance Services and a Dispensary. The hostel accommodation is subject to availability of seats.

1.8 HEALTH CARE

The University Health Centre looks after the medical needs of the students, staff and their families. Facilities for protective inoculation exist in the Health Centre. Complete Physiotherapy Unit, Computerized ECG, X-Ray Machine with C.R. System, Round the Clock modern Ambulance facility, adequate Laboratory facilities & Auto Analyzer facilities are available in the Health Centre. Dental facilities are also available in the Health Centre (i.e. Digital X-Ray, extraction, fillings, scaling, root canal treatments, cosmetic dental procedures i.e. tooth coloured fillings, dental checkup of students at University School, dental examination care of students, teachers, attending academic sports and cultural activities). The University has more than 63 private doctors with different specializations on its panel for consultation free of cost. Free Health Checkup & Awareness Camp facilities on regular basis also provided & maximum availability of medicines are also available.

1.9 CAREER AND COUNSELING CELL

The aim and objective of behind the establishment of Career and Counseling Cell in the University has been to provide an opportunity to the students to overcome multifaceted socio-economic handicaps. Since its inception, the Career and Counseling Cell has incessantly assimilated students of the diverse culture and ethnicity and has served as a common platform for them to work towards attaining highest standards in the diverse field of human endeavors. The Cell abides by its avowed aim of making the students inculcate moral values and beliefs to serve the society and humanity at large while striving towards attaining higher efficiency to face the challenges of competitive tests along with imparting knowledge on job training in add-on vocational courses. In this connection, the Career and Counseling Cell has developed itself into an indispensable and invaluable department offering guidance, information and counseling with open accessibility to all with no cost incurred. The Cell has been equipped with internet facility facilitating global connectivity for exchange of ideas and information on professional placement.

1.10 PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell in the University has meticulously fulfilled its purpose with ardent zeal as an indispensable and valuable aid in the field of career guidance with a focused approach to meet the needs of the time and to boost the career drives for the University students. The Cell imparts career guidance and serves as a distinguished platform to organize corporate interaction to the University students. The Cell also works towards organizing employability skills enhancement programmes for the University students. The Cell is lead and headed by a Placement Officer along with a team of illustrious teacher(s) coordinates and students coordinators at departmental level. The Cell works with the aim of coordinating and organizing on Campus interviews/placements drives/summer internship/industrial visit etc. The Cell aims at attaining higher level of efficiency through personality development and skills development programmes. It has served the very mission of providing the country skilled entrepreneurs by initiating the University students to become part of executive meets, motivational talks/discourse and other activities conducive to the career guidance and holistic development of the students.

1.11 ADDRESSING WOMEN AND SOCIETAL CONCERNS

1.11.1 Women's Studies Research Centre

The Centre reflects the University's commitment to society and its policy of inclusive growth. The Centre is fulfilling its objectives of women empowerment through training, research, curriculum development, documentation, networking, providing counseling services and launching awareness programmes. The Centre offers two full time programmes in Women's Studies - M.A. (Women Studies) two years (semester system) and P.G. Diploma in Women's Studies one year (annual examination). The Centre has also been

working as a Nodal Agency to guide and monitor the functions of Women Cells in the colleges of Haryana. The Centre is a Phase-III Centre of the University Grants Commission making it one of the top few in the Country. The Centre's library and research documentation are rated as one of the best in the country. As part of the Extension Work, the Centre regularly organizes Gender Sensitization Programmes cum Awareness Campaigns in the different Departments and Colleges on the Campus as well as for different stake holders and community. The Centre in its efforts to developing capacities and entrepreneurial skill among girls and women, regularly conducts training workshops for female panchayat members, students and faculty members on issues like leadership, financial literacy, health and wellness etc. The Centre is also providing six months training in Tailoring & Embroidery to girls and women in order to help them to become self-reliant through five free training centres in the villages adopted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

1.11.2 Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) against Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal)

Kurukshetra University is committed to provide to all women a place of work and study free of sexual harassment, intimidation and exploitation. It is expected that all students, faculty, staff, karamcharis and officials treat one another and visitors to the University with respect. Reports of sexual harassment are taken seriously and dealt with promptly.

Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra has zero tolerance policy towards sexual harassment of women. Strict action will be taken against anyone found guilty of such behavior. Sexual harassment can take place in various forms; some subtle and indirect, some blatant and overt. For instance anyone or more of the following acts of unwelcome behaviour (directly or by implication); physical contact and advances, a demand or request for sexual favours, making sexually coloured remarks, showing pornography, any other unwelcome physical, verbal or nonverbal conduct of sexual nature.

Kurukshetra University Policy against Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) 2015 is available on its website: www.kuk.ac.in. This policy is a compliance with (SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF WOMEN AT WORK PLACE PREVENTION, PROHIBITION AND REDRESSAL ACT 2013).

As per policy Kurukshetra University constitutes ICC every year representing different stakeholders and this list remains available on University website. The list of ICC members and their contact numbers are circulated to teaching departments/institutes and non-teaching offices. Moreover, posters containing information about KUK policy against sexual harassment and contact information of ICC office are displayed throughout the campus.

If any, female student/employee is being sexual harassed, she should not hesitate but report the matter immediately. Complaints can be made directly to Chairperson or any member of ICC (icc@kuk.ac.in) or through existing channels of lodging grievances, such as University Authorities, Wardens, Teachers, Students, Union/Association Representatives, and Administrative Superiors etc. Third Party (any individual who is not a party to the incidents) can also register complaints. Privacy and confidentiality of complainant is maintained.

The University secured Third Position in the MAKA Trophy in the session 2021-22.

The Directorate of Sports of the University has established the perfect path for the development of University Sports by adopting the professional approach. The Department runs the Centres for upcoming promising Sports Persons in all disciplines for imparting the training and organizes the specific advance training programmes during the Camps before participation into the National Competitions. The University provides maximum Sports facilities, programmes and activities to enable the students to achieve and maintain a fit, healthy and enjoyable life style. The University has two Multipurpose Halls with

PVC Vinyl Synthetic Sports Flooring of International standards. The New Hall is equipped with all the Indoor Sports facilities like Basketball, Volleyball, Gymnastics, Judo & Wrestling etc. The Weight Lifting facility is also available in this Hall. The facilities of Boxing & Badminton (03 Courts) are available in the Old Multipurpose Hall. The University has a Standard Swimming Pool and a new double storey Shooting Range. In addition to these, a Table Tennis Hall, a Standard 400 mts. Grassy Athletic track and all the outdoor grounds are also available. A climbing wall facility for adventure Sports is also available. Almost 20,000 students of the University Campus & affiliated Colleges are utilizing these facilities.

The Directorate of Sports of the University provides the channels & ample opportunities to the budding athletes of campus & affiliated colleges to perform with excellence at National & International level. The Department organizes about 80 Inter-Collegiate Championships in men & women sections in different sports disciplines. Coaching camps of minimum 30 days for the University teams, prior to their participation in the Inter-University Championship are organized. The Department sends about 80 teams consisting of 800 men & women players approx. for participation in Inter University Championships and organizes 2-3 North Zone/All India Inter University Championships, every year.

The University gives the huge card Cash Award to the outstanding sports persons for securing 1st, 2nd& 3rd Positions in the Inter University & International Competitions. A Sports kit of Rs. 3000/- approx. is provided to each player, who represents the University in the Inter University Championships.

1.12.2 Department of Youth and Cultural Affairs

Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra is one of the best platforms for the artists in Haryana working for the promotion, preservation and documentation of rich cultural heritage of our state for the last four decades. The Department of Youth & Cultural Affairs aims at providing opportunities, incentives and channels to student for making healthy, educative and constructive use of their leisure for self-fulfillment and excellence. The Department organizes various activities and programmes for the students of the University Teaching Departments and affiliated Colleges such as Independence day, Talent Show Competition at all the affiliated colleges, Celebration of Sanskrit Week, Celebration of Hindi Diwas, Zonal, Inter Zonal Youth Festival, Ratnawali Haryana Day State Level Festival and recently Loor Dance has been introduced from the session 2022-23, Declamation Contest on the occasion of Gita Jayanti Utsav (Kurukshetra Mahotsav), Inter Collegiate Kamal Nayan Bajaj Elocution Competition, Participation in Kamal Nayan Bajaj National Elocution Competition at Shiksha Mandal, Wardha, Literary Workshop-cum-Competition, Fine arts Competition-cum-workshop, Quiz competition, Kamlesh Memo. Poetical Symposium, Participation in North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by the A.I.U. Celebration of Republic Day, Participation in All India Inter University National, Youth Festival organized by the A.I.U., Participation in SAUFEST (South Asian Universities Festival, Kala Utsav, International Youth Festival) organized by the A.I.U. Ratnawali Yuva Saang Mahotsav at Four zones, Adventurous Programme/Youth Leadership Camp, Two Trekking Camps (UG), Two Trekking Camps (PG), Two Advance Youth Leadership Camps (Boys & Girls) (UG & PG), Two Basis Youth Leadership Camps (Boys & Girls) (UG&PG), One Advance Youth Leadership Camp for Professional Colleges.

1.12.3 National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The University has a well-equipped contingent of NCC Battalion under the charge of experienced and trained officers of 10 Haryana Bn. NCC, Kurukshetra. Separate arrangements have been made for boys and girls to facilitate them to join NCC. Apart from regular training parades, the Cadets attend NCC Camps for centralized training with their counterparts from other institutions. The Units prepare them for taking up the higher NCC Certificate Examinations. NCC Cadets are also groomed for assisting the administration in the proper and orderly conduct of special events and in relief work in civic emergencies. The Unit also presents brief programmes during the Republic and Independence Day Celebrations, and on special occasions such as the NCC Day. The University lays special emphasis on training students for the armed forces by arranging

lectures and guidance programmes. A special facility is provided in the sports complex to help students prepare for entry into the forces. SFS seats in NCC have also been made available in the University for the students of self-finance courses.

1.12.4 National Service Scheme (NSS)

Kurukshetra University is a founder member of NSS Programme, since 1969. At present there are 14,638 volunteers enrolled with 162 units in 101 affiliated colleges. The volunteers take keen interest in various NSS activities and last year 66 special 7 day NSS Camps were organized. The Volunteers donated 3,500 units of blood. Several awareness programmes such as Swachhta Mission: Ek Bharat, Saresth Bharat, Jal Sarankshan, Samajik Samrasta, Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyan/Digital India, Bharat Summer Internship, Swachhta Pakwhware, AIDS awareness campaign, Yoga Programme for Society, Fit India Freedom Run 3.0, Clean India 2.0, Vigilance Awareness Week, Crop Residue Management Scheme, Run For Unity, Constitution Day Celebration, Anti Tobacco Day, Poshan Maah, Road Safety Week, Flag Day, Voter Awareness and various social issues including Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, Environmental Pollution, COVID-19 Awareness & Protection Campaign Abhiyan, Awareness for the Health & Hygiene etc. are regularly undertaken by the NSS volunteers. National Integration Camp (NIC) was also organised. University Teaching Departments has four units of NSS, where students can work for community and participate in various activities.

1.13 INCLUSIVE GROWTH

1.13.1 Mahatma Gandhi All India Service Coaching Institute (MGAIS)

The Mahatma Gandhi All India Services Coaching Institute was established in the year 1982. The prime purpose of the Institute is to encourage the students coming from the downtrodden and backward sections of the society including SC/ST students by way of providing them coaching and counseling for the UGC NET Examinations, Haryana Civil Services Examinations, All India Services Examinations and other remedial coaching. The Library of Mahatma Gandhi All India Services Coaching Institute in the University has specific collections of books and reading material relating to the various competition examinations.

The students are advised to look for the notices issues by the Institute from time to time display on the notice board of the MGAIS Coaching Institute and University website (www.kuk.ac.in).

1.13.2 SC/ST Cell

The Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Cell was established in the year 1984 with the financial assistance of the University Grants Commission. The main objectives of the Cell are to look after the work of Coordination, Evaluation and Monitoring of the implementation of programme/work relating to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students/employees of this University. It is the duty of the Cell to see that the guidelines issued by the Govt. of India/University Grants Commission/State Govt. in favour of the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates are implemented effectively.

The Cell has been working as a Nodal Agency for supplying of various types of statistical information in respect of the students, teachers and other employees of the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes categories in the University for onward transmission to the Govt. of India/University Grants Commission/State Govt. from time to time after collecting the same from various University Teaching Departments/Institutes/Colleges/ Branches of the University.

The Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Cell remains in constant touch with various agencies of the Govt. in order to apprise the various welfare schemes to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes students of the University.

Keeping in view the above objectives the University has been carrying out welfare activities for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes students studying in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra during the period under report. The Cell provides winter clothing to extremely needy and poor students and financial assistance.

1.13.3 Centre for Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Studies

The Centre for Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Studies was set up in Kurukshetra University in June, 1992 to mark the centenary celebration of Baba Saheb Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar who played important role in the constitutional development and emancipation of the Scheduled Castes and weaker sections of the society. The objectives of the centre are: to study the work of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar scientifically and objectively; to understand Dr. Ambedkar's relevance today; to study problems such as untouchability, social injustice etc. in the light of his ideas and vision; to collect and publish writings and speeches on Dr. Ambedkar; to bring out publications and journal devoted to his life and the subjects in which he contributed and to propagate the philosophy of Dr. Ambedkar among the downtrodden and other weaker sections of the society; to encourage students of M.Phil and Ph.D. programme and other scholars to work on Dr. Ambedkar and Dalit Literature; to hold seminars, symposia, lectures and competitions on Dr. Ambedkar's life, work and ideology and to provide a common platform to the scholars working on Dr. Ambedkar in India and abroad to share their views and experiences.

1.14 TAKING EDUCATION TO THE DOOR STEPS

1.14.1 Distance Education Programme

Kurukshetra University started Distance Education Programmes in 1976 through Directorate of Correspondence Courses with a vision of providing higher education opportunities to the large number of aspiring persons who could not be part of regular education. Since then the Directorate has been attempting to provide access to quality education at affordable fees through ODL Modes. The Directorate was re-casted as Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) to keep pace with the advancements in Distance Education Modes. It has consistently evolved and reinvented with times and in the recent years more than 20,000 students enrolled in about 39 undergraduate and post graduate conventional programmes and job-oriented professional courses in the area of Commerce, Library & Information Science, Computer Science, Management, Journalism and many more. Its programmes/courses meet students' demand and social needs. The curricula are updated alongwith regular courses, to offer at par education to the students of distance education. The important programmes offered by the Directorate are MBA, MCA and two year B.Ed. Its NCTE approved B.Ed. programme benefit working teachers in school and educational institutions across the country. DDE is making persistent efforts to provide more opportunities for distance education and has started 6 new courses as Category-I University in the area of business Analytics, Cyber Law, Taxation, Human Rights, Gita and Yoga in 2018-19 and plans to offer more courses in the new and emerging areas in the coming years. All programmes/courses of the Directorate are UGC entitled.

The learning mode adopted by the Directorate involves use of study material for self-learning and annual Personal Contact Programme (PCP) for teacher assisted learning. DDE teachers provide round the year personal counselling to its students and the schedule for the same is displayed on the website for the information of students. The study material of DDE in SIM format is made available in both print and soft forms. The soft version can be downloaded from the DDE Website using a unique ID allotted to each student. DDE aim is to provide all study material in the form of ISBN numbered books. The Directorate provides many facilities to its students such as centrally air conditioned Library, well equipped computer Labs, with internet facility, teaching-block exclusively for the class of distance education students, canteen and other amenities. The Directorate has kept pace with times and uses its own website www.ddekuk.ac.in for online admission and other information. It uses a mobile app 'DDEKUK' for better and effective communication with the students that is available free on the Google Play Store. It uses SMS service to provide the information to the students, quickly and efficiently.

An important feature of DDE evaluation system is its comprehensiveness using 20% Internal Assessment in all UG/PG (except B.Ed.) classes and 80% external evaluation. The internal assessment is added to external exam marks for deciding result of students. DDE has been offering incentive for girls' education beginning

2017-18 in phased manner for B.A. programme through its scheme 'Shikshit Beti' which provides 25% concession in tuition fee to the girl student having more than 70% marks at 10+2 level. Hostel facilities are made available to girls during PCP to ensure equity.

The Pirectorate and its ability to support education in the country is its biggest achievement. The Directorate has been acknowledged for its efforts on many occasions namely: Ranked No. 1 by Career 360 Magazine in the year 2012, awarded with "Dnyandeep Award" by Yashwantrao Chavan, Maharashtra Open University, Nasik, Maharashtra in 2015, conferred with the "CSR Top Distance Learning Institutes of India Award" for the year 2016 by the Competition Success Review, New Delhi. It again got the same recognition from CSR in 2018 & 2019. In 2020, Directorate of Distance Education started two academic sessions i.e. January and July session. These recognitions have strengthened the commitment of Directorate towards quality education and empowerment of the society. DDE plans to build more students friendly systems with the use of technology and wishes that learners from all sections of the society get opportunities for higher education.

Recently the Directorate has introduced four UGC-DEB entitled four online degree programmes i.e. B.A., B.Com., M.Com & M.A.(Mass Comm.) alongwith some certificate and diploma level courses in foreign languages and technology area in accordance with Technology Mission of India. Details of these are given below:

1.15 CONNECTING WITH THE ROOTS

1.15.1 'Dharohar' - Museum of Haryana Heritage

The Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra established Dharohar a museum dedicated to Haryana heritage and culture on April 28, 2006. Its huge popularity since 2006 is reflected in the number of visitors who have visited the museum. The Dharohar is dedicated to Haryanas' heritage and a scale that would attract national and international popularities in it.

Upto January, 2023 the Museum was visited by about 28,41,607 visitors. Delegates from 110 different countries visited Dharohar Haryana Museum during these years. The Dharohar Haryana Museum also a house of literary and research centre devoted to promotion of quality research in various disciplines of study in Haryana. About 8,676 Research Scholars for doing the work on heritage and culture of Haryana has so far visited.

Displays have been presented in a thematic concept spread over different sections. The Museum is divided in two parts – the 1st Phase and the 2nd Phase. The 1st Phase displays the sections like War Heroes, Domestic Articles, Art & Craft Sections. Haryanavi Ornaments and Folk Customes, Folk Theater and Library, Profession Tools and Rasoi, Freedom Fighter Section, Construction and Architecture, Folk Musical Instruments, Wall Paintings, Archeological Heritage, Manuscripts Sections. Folk Festivals, Gher/Cattles Section, Charpai & Hukka Sections, Water Heritage, Transportation Means.

The Museum is poised a major expansion by 2nd Phase in Dharohar having different sections displayed in distinct sections devoted to Khera the Village Deity, Thathera the Tinker, Sunar the Gold Smith, Maniyar the Bangle Seller, Tokre Wala the Basket Maker, Kumhar the Potter, Pathera the Weaver, Yagya the Sacrificial Offering, Ahirwal, Pathar Shilpkar Stones Mason, Baniya the Village Shopkeeper, Badai the Carpenter, Leelgar the Dyer, Darji the Tailor, Charmakar, Shoe Maker, Brij, Mewat, Bharkash ke Deshaj Sadhan Modes of Travel & Transport, Bohia, Hara-Kala Papier Mache and Clay Work, Tantiya Telli, Cotton Threshing and Oil Extraction, Luhar the Blacksmith, Sikligar the Locksmith and Tools-Sharpner, Muddha the Indigenous Arm-Chair, the Barber, Kohlu Making of Jaggery in Kohlu, the Oil Extractor (Teli), Panghat the Village Well.

1.15.2 Institute of Sanskrit and Indological Studies

The Institute of Sanskrit and Indological Studies was established in 1963 in order to pursue Indological Research. Initially it started the publication of **Prachi-Jyoti-Digest of Indological Studies** (published

annually), which is continuously serving the needs of scholars throughout the world. 46 volumes have since been published. The Institute has undertaken a Major Research Project, "A Word-Concordance of Mahabharata," which is to be published in Fifteen Volumes. All fifteen volumes have been published. A new course "P.G. Diploma in Knowledge Traditions in Sanskrit and Indology" of one year started in the Institute.

1.15.3 Corporate Resource Centre

The University established a Corporate Resource Centre for a larger industry-academia interface in higher education in 2007. It is a Nodal Centre for ongoing interaction between academics and industry for furthering the horizon of education and research. The Centre is aimed at seeking wider industry participation in the academic research, programme designing, and curricula delivery. The centre helps and encourages research faculty to seek corporate industry assignments and acquaint the students with latest and updated knowledge and practices. Students are the end beneficiary of this endeavour as their skills and competencies are honed up through innovative curricula and its enriched delivery to magnify their employability at higher end and inculcate entrepreneurial pursuits. This has also opened up possibilities of bringing real life corporate experience and interactive teaching-learning for the benefit of students.

1.15.4 Committee for Environment Friendly Alternative

Committee for Environment Friendly Alternative constituted to facilitate environment protection in the campus, organizes activities to increase awareness about pertinent environmental issues among employees and residents of the campus and to maintain a sustainable, clean and green campus through conservation of resources. 3.2 GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION:

- (i) If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block 'A' remain vacant these will be filled up from BC Block 'B' and vice versa.
- (ii) The seats remaining vacant under various reserved categories other than SC category will be converted into General Category only if up to the date of display of final list or day of final counselling (whichever applicable), no eligible candidate belonging to the respective reserved categories is available for admission. These vacant seats will be filled up by Haryana General Category (HGC), in case no candidate of HGC is available it will be offered to the candidates of All India Category.
- (iii) The Haryana Govt. vide Notification No.22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 22.03.2022 has intimated that as per Govt. Instruction No.22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 21.03.2014 regarding issuance of caste certificate wherein various competent authorities to verify and issue caste certificate were notified alongwith other terms & conditions and formats of the caste certificates.
 - The Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021, provides for the assignment of the Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a unique identifier number to each family. The database, namely Family Information Data Repository (FIDR), contains PPN alongwith corresponding information generally required for determining eligibility for, or the provision of any scheme, service, subsidy or benefit provided/implemented by or on behalf of the State Govt./any Govt. Agency/Local Authority. State Govt. has been empowered under Section 8 of Act to prescribe Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a requirement for the purpose of determining above mentioned eligibility or provision. The verified information linked with PPN available in Family Information Data Respository (FIDR) has now made it feasible to issue Caste Certificates over the Counter through SARAL Portal. In view of the above, Govt has issued revised instructions/guidelines in supersession of all the previous instructions issued till now, as under:
 - (a) Portal for the issue of Caste Certificate: The Caste Certificate (including Certificates for Scheduled Caste, Deprived Scheduled Caste, Bakward Class, Other Backward Class, Tapriwas, Vimukt Jati (Denotified Tribes), and Nomadic Tribe) shall now be issued to eligible residents of Haryna based on PPN through the SARAL portal (https://saralharyana.gov.in) facsimile signed by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner-cum-District Citizen Resources Information Officer) or Head of the Department/Organisation, as the case may be.

(b) Validity of a Caste Certificate:

- 1. A Caste Certificate once issued (in its standard format) shall be valid for the life time of the person so long as such caste/tribe is not removed or modified in the notifications issued by the Welfare of SC and BC Dept., Haryana.
- 2. Where a Caste Certificate is requested for specific use outside the context of Govt. of Haryana, it shall be issued in the format prescribed by the Govt. of India.
- 3. Certificates which include income and/or assets based information like creamy layer criteria shall become invalid after the validity period prescribed on the said certificate. Such certificates shall be valid for the current financial year i.e. till coming 31st March (included) from the date it has been issued.
- 4. A Caste Certificate may also become invalid if after due process, it has been concluded that the caste was incorrectly mentioned on the certificate or wrongly verified in the FIDR, due to any reason whatsoever.
- (iv) As per Govt. Notification No.2/27/2019-1 GS-III dated 8.10.2020 (Appendix-F) and No.22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 22.03.2022 (Appendix-G), the candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste will submit the certificate as per Annexure-II (1) (Scheduled Caste Certificate) and Annexure-II (2) (Deprived Scheduled Caste Certificate). Backward Class (Block 'A' & 'B') will submit the certificate on the prescribed Proforma as per Annexure-III and Income Certificate from the Competent Authority. Vide Notification No. 512-SW(1)2021 dated 01.12.2021 and 491-SW(1) dated 17.11.2021(Appendix-H) the Government of Haryana Welfare of Scheduled

Castes and Backward Classes Department has specified the criteria for persons within Backward Class as Creamy Layer regarding Reservation in Services and Admissions in Educational Institution. Son(s) and daughter (s) of parents having gross annual income of Rs.6 Lakhs or above OR possessing wealth above Rs.1 Crore for period of last three consecutive years. Income from all sources shall be clubbed to arrive at the gross annual income.

- Affidavit/Undertaking by the BC and EWS Candidates: BC (Block A&B) and EWS candidates (v) for benefit of reservation shall also have to furnish the certificates as per proforma given in the Hand Book of Information. In case, a candidates upload the old BC/Income Certificate or EWS Income & Asset Certificate, he/she shall furnish an affidavit on the prescribed proforma to the effect that he/she is not covered under the criteria of creamy layer (for BC Category) (Annexure-XVI) or belongs to Economically Weaker Sections (Annexure XVII), which is not recognized as a Schedule Caste and Backward Classes (Block-A & B) by the Government of Haryana, as per Annexure-III&IV, respectively at the time of display of first/second/third/final list and so on. The said affidavit shall be furnished jointly by both father and mother of the candidate. The student shall submit BC/Income Certificate or EWS Income & Asset Certificate within 15 days from the date of display of his/her name in admission list, failing which his/her admission is liable to be cancelled. The income certificate mentioning gross annual income issued on/after 1.4.2023 for claiming reservation/supernumerary seat/tuition fee waiver in any category (where admission criteria is income based) shall only be considered for availing benefit under any reserved category/supernumerary seat/tuition fee waiver category.
- (vi) Only the candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. Disability certificate must be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District. However, the certificate shall be subject to verification by a Medical Board of the University constituted for the purpose and the decision of the Board shall be final. Differently Abled candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-VI (Medical certificate for Differently abled) given in the HBI.
- (vii) A Medical Board of the following doctors for the session 2023-24 has been constituted for verification of differently abled certificates of differently abled candidates for admission to various programmes in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes:
 - (a) Dr. Ashish Aneja, M.O.... (Chairman)
 - (b) Dr. Minu Gupta, M.O..... (Member)
 - (c) Dr. Ankit Gaur, Dental Surgeon.... (Member)
- (viii) Children and Grand-Children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner of the concerned District as per **Annexure-VII**.
- (ix) Certificate from Ex-Servicemen and their wards for Deceased or Disabled or Discharged Military/ Paramilitary Personnel, Ex-Servicemen or Ex-Personnel of Para-Military Forces as per Annexure-VIII.
- (x) Certificate from Ex-Employees and their wards for the Ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/Paramilitary Forces as per **Annexure-IX**.
- (xi) For horizontal reservation, ESM/DFF candidates of General, SC and BC category will also have to furnish ESM/DFF certificate.
- (xii) In pursuance of the decision of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh dated 11.04.2013 in the LPA 98/2013 (O&M) CWP No.20359 of 2012, Sh. Ishwar Singh Vs KUK &Others, preference shall be given to ESM first before giving admission to wards against ESM reserved seats
- (xiii) As per instructions of the Government of Haryana, General Administration Department, General Services-III Branch, Chandigarh containing in letter No. 22/10/2013-1GSIII dated 10.08.2017 for giving following priorities for reservations or preferences to the wards of Armed Forces personnel for admission in medical/professional/non-professional programmes running in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes/Affiliated/Maintained Colleges/Institutes:

The Admission Committee vide its Res. No. 6 dated 14.05.2018 has resolved the above instructions of the State Govt. be implemented in all the programmes being run in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes and affiliated/ maintained Colleges.

- (xiv) Under Differently Abled category, at least one seat wll be offered, even if the share is less than 0.5 seat.
- (xv) If a candidate of Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs also apply for Differently Abled/ESM/ DFF category will be considered first for Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs category.
- (xvi) * All the eligible candidates, whether from Haryana or from reserved categories can also compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
- (xvii) *All the eligible candidates of reserved categories of Haryana shall be considered first for Haryana General category seats.
- *(Note: Allotment of seats under Clause (xvi) & (xvii) above shall be strictly as per Director General Higher Education, Haryana Letter No.12/1-2017AD(3) Dated 04.06.2018 and Principal Secretary to Govt. Haryana Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh letter No.EC/2018/20179-389 dated 26.04.2018 as per Appendix-D (1-2).
- (xviii) Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a university in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificates of bonafide residents of Haryana.
- (xix) 30% seats in M.P.Ed., B.P.Ed. and P.G. Diploma in Yoga will be reserved for female candidates in all categories.
- (xx) Differently Abled candidates will not be considered for admission to M.P.Ed., B.P.Ed. and P.G. Diploma in Yoga.
- (xxi) Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 as under:

(a) Income & Assets Certificate issuing Authority:

- (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
- (ii) As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-III Branch) Notification No.22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.
- (iii) The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at Annexure-IV.

(b) Criteria of Income & Assets:

- (i) Persons, who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only), are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
- (ii) Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- b) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
- e) Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs.One Crore of more.
- (iii) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- (iv) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

Note: For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred.

(xx). Criteria for EWS in All India Category seats:

The reservation @ 10% to Economically Weaker Sections in All India Category seats (i.e. 15% of sanctioned intake) under Centre Govt. policy would be in addition to the existing reservation. Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India Notification No.36039/1/2019-Estt (Res) dated 31.01.2019 and the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide their letter No.40395 DHE-190005/97/2020-UNP (STATE)-DHE dated 19.04.2021(Appendix - E) as under:

(a) Criteria of Income & Assets:

(i) Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- (a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- (b) Residential fiat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- (c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- (d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- (ii) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- (iii) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

(b) Income and Asset Certificate Issuing Authority:

- (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in **Annexure-V** shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:
 - (a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/1st Class Stipendary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
 - (b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
 - (c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and
 - (d) Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

In addition to the sanctioned seats, additional/supernumerary seats for the following categories shall be as under:

- 4.1 Two (02) supernumerary seats for the outstanding sports persons, over and above the sanctioned seats in PG programmes including Integrated programmes for the session 2023-24 except in the programmes regulated by the AICTE/NCTE/PCI/BCI/RCI etc. For these courses, the seats for outstanding sports person will be given within the sanctioned seats. Seat to the outstanding sports person will be given against the quota reserved for his/her reserved category which he/she belongs. The above supernumerary seats to the outstanding sports persons will be allotted in order of preference and in order of merit in sports achievements, irrespective of other criteria of admission subject to eligibility as given below:
 - (a) Position in any Recognised International Competition.
 - (b) Participation in any Recognised International Competition.
 - (c) Winning First Three Positions in Senior National/Federation Cup/Inter Zonal National/National Games.
 - (d) Winning First Three Positions in All India Inter-University.
 - (e) Winning First Three Positions in Khelo India University Games.
 - (f) Winning First Three Positions in North/East/South/West Zone Inter University Tournaments.
 - (g) Participation in National Games/Senior National/Federation Cup/Inter Zonal National/All India/Zonal Inter University Tournaments.
 - (h) Winning First Three Positions in Junior National
 - (i) Winning First Three Positions in Youth National.
 - (j) Winning First Three Positions in School National (under-17 Yr/19 Yr.).
 - (k) Winning First Three Positions in Khelo India Youth Games.
 - (1) Participation at School National/Youth National/Junior National/Khelo India Youth Games.

Norms and guidelines for supernumerary seats/weightages for outstanding sports persons, for admission in P.G. Programmes including integrated programmes in the university campus:

Norms for Outstanding Sports Person: Outstanding Sports Person means a person who has at least participated in the Zonal /All India Inter University or Senior National Level Championship or above. This include (Senior National, Federation Cup, National League, Inter Zonal National, National Games/National University Games/Khelo India University Games during the course of his/her Graduate/Post Graduate/Integrated studies).

Guidelines for Supernumerary Seats/Weightages: Sports Certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produces the Gradation Certificate from the respective Govt. in respect of the game/sports for which the candidate claim outstanding sports person seat. In case any state does not issue the Gradation Certificate, the following criteria will be adopted:

- (a) In case of International/National Position or participation, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/State Association.
- (b) In case of Inter University Position or participation, other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Head of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- (c) The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Kurukshetra University Sports Calendar.
- (d) The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation/Association duly affiliated with State Olympic Association/Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- (e) Achievement during the programme of Graduate, Post-Graduate including Integrated studies will be considered for admission in Post-Graduate programmes.
- (f) No sports achievement lower than the above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.
- (g) No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra/CBSE National, Vidya Bharti Nationals/Rural Tournaments/Panchayat Tournaments /Novaodya Nationals and invitation non-recognised tournaments/sports festivals.

4.2 Two (02) supernumerary seats, over and above sanctioned seats in the first year of all the Bachelor Degree/UG programmes including integrated programmes except in the programmes regulated by the AICTE/NCTE/PCI/BCI/RCI etc. For these courses, the seats for outstanding sports person will be given within the sanctioned seats. Seat to the outstanding sports person will be given against the quota reserved for his/her reserved category which he/she belongs.

The above supernumerary seats to the outstanding sports persons will be allotted in order of preference and in order of merit in sports achievements, irrespective of other criteria of admission subject to eligibility as given below:

- (a) Position in any Recognised International Competition.
- (b) Participation in any Recognised International Competition.
- (c) Winning First Three Positions in Senior National/Federation Cup/Inter Zonal National/National Games.
- (d) Winning First Three Positions in All India Inter-University.
- (e) Winning First Three Positions in Khelo India University Games.
- (f) Winning First Three Positions in North/East/South/West Zone Inter University Tournaments.
- (g) Participation in National Games/Senior National/Federation Cup/Inter Zonal National/All India /Zonal Inter University Tournaments.
- (h) Winning First Three Positions in Junior National
- (i) Winning First Three Positions in Youth National.
- (j) Winning First Three Positions in School National (under-17 Yr/19 Yr.).
- (k) Winning First Three Positions in Khelo India Youth Games.
- (1) Participation at School National/Youth National/Junior National/Khelo India Youth Games.

Norms and guidelines for supernumerary seats/weightages for outstanding sports persons, for admission in first year of all the bachelor degree/under graduate programmes including integrated programmes in the university campus.

Norms For Outstanding Sports Person: Outstanding sports person means a person who has at least participated in the School Nationals/Junior National/Khelo India Youth Games/Youth National/ National School Games in [under 19/17 (nineteen/ seventeen) year Age Group] or above in the preceding three years.

Guidelines for Supernumerary Seats/Weightages: Sports Certificate for admission will only be considered, if the candidate produces the Gradation Certificate from the respective Govt. in respect of the game/sports for which the candidate claim outstanding sports person seat.

In case any state does not issue the Gradation Certificate, the following criteria will be adopted:

- (a) In case of International/ National participation, a certificate of authenticity will be required from concerned National Federation/State Association.
- (b) In case of Inter University participation other than Kurukshetra University, a certificate of authenticity from the Director Sports/Head of Sports of the concern University will be required.
- (c) The game/event must be in the scheduled list of Kurukshetra University Sports Calendar.
- (d) The tournament must be organised by recognised Federation/Association duly affiliated with State Olympic Association/Indian Olympic Association and Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
- (e) Achievements of the proceeding three years will be considered for Under-Graduate programmes.
- (f) No sports achievement lower than the above will be considered for admission for outstanding sports person category, even if the seats remain vacant.
- (g) No weightage will be given for participating/winning positions in the sports and games organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra/CBSE National, Vidya Bharti Nationals/Rural Tournaments/Panchayat Tournaments/Navodaya Nationals and invitation non-recognised tournaments/sports festivals.
- **4.3** One additional seat in all programmes will be for NCC cadets who have attended the Republic Day (R.D.) Parade and Camp over and above the sanctioned seats.
- **4.4** One additional seat in all programmes will be for NSS Merit Certificate holders who have attended the Republic Day (R.D.) Parade and Camp over and above the sanctioned seats.

4.5 As per instructions issued by the Director Higher Education, Haryana vide their letter No.18/51-2000 UNP (4) dated 27.01.2020, the concession for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir Valley for admission in Higher Educational Institutions is over and above the State Reservation Policy and requested to follow the instructions of Govt. of India issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education vide F. No.3-4/2017-NER dated 15.10.2019 until the instructions are withdrawn or amended.

Vide Admission Committee Res. No. 1(iv) dated 16.06.2020, One additional seat over and above the sanctioned seats in all programmes for Kashmiri Migrants and One additional seat over and above the sanctioned seat in all programmes for Kashmiri Pandits/ Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants living in the Kashmir Valley) in the UTDs./Institutes. These seats will be interchangeable, if the candidate of concerned category is not available. The candidates seeking admission under Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir Valley seats should upload attested copies of the following documents along with the Admission Application Form:

(a) Kashmiri Migrants

- (i) Attested copy of migration certificate duly signed by competent authority or Relief Commissioner.
- (ii) Proof of current residence such as Ration Card, Aadhaar Card, Photo Identity Card/Voter Card, issued by the Election Commissioner, Driving License etc.
- (b) Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir Valley: Attested copy of Domicile Certificate at the time of submission of Application Form.
- 4.6 Vide Executive Res. No. 24 dated 29.12.2016 one supernumerary seat over and above the sanctioned seats has been created for a single girl child of her real parents or one amongst the only two girl children of those real parents who have only two girl children and have no male child, in all the Programmes governed by the UGC (Except PCI, BCI, RCI, AICTE and NCTE governed Programmes) being run in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes w.e.f. the session 2017-18. Eligibility for admission to supernumerary seat for a single girl child is as under:
 - (a) The supernumerary seat will be given only to the girl child holding Haryana Domicile, if she is otherwise eligible and her name appears in the merit list.
 - (b) Admission to supernumerary seat in a programme will be made as per the eligibility criteria and merit for admission purpose (MAP) fixed for the programme given in the HBI. If there are more than one candidates applying for admission to this supernumerary seat, the admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit fixed for the purpose of admission in the programme.
 - (c) If the supernumerary seat in a programme remains vacant due to non-availability of suitable candidate, it may not be offered to a candidate of any other category and will remain vacant.

4.7 Supernumerary Seats for International Students:

- 15% seats in all programmes are classified as supernumerary seats for Foreign Students out of which 10% shall be earmarked for foreigners and 5% seats shall be earmarked for wards of Indians working in Gulf and South East Asia. These seats are interchangeable. Foreign students, if admitted, will have to produce No Objection Certificate from the Ministry of External Affairs and/or Ministry of Education, Govt. of India, irrespective of anything contained in any other Handbook Calendar published by this University. Detailed rules for admission to Foreign Students are given in the Chapter-7.
- 4.8 As approved by the Bar Council of India, the Dept. of Law can fill maximum 180 seats as a whole in three sections (60 students in each section) and Institute of Law can fill maximum 120 seats as a whole in two sections (60 students in each section). Eight (08) additional/supernumerary seats for admission to LL.B. (Professional) 3 Yr. programme and B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) 5 Yr. Integrated programme will be treated as special provision seats w.e.f. the session 2020-21. If these seats remain vacant, the same will be filled amongst the other eligible candidates as per reservation policy of the State Govt.

4.9 Supernumerary Seats for Tuition Fees Waiver Scheme:

As per instructions issued by the Director, Technical Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide letter No. 87-89/Pvt. Colleges dated 15.01.2019 and AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2023-24, the Committee in its meeting held on 24.04.2023 has resolved that the Tuition Fees Waiver Scheme has been extended for the session 2023-24, where 50% seats of approved intake are filled up in last Academic Year in the following programmes/Institutions approved by AICTE, in which no Scholarship/Stipend is available, shall be for the candidates who will be admitted under Tuition Fees Waiver Scheme on the University Campus:

To implement this scheme following guidelines are framed for the session 2023-24 in the light of AICTE "Approval, Process, Handbook 2023-24":

- 1) Candidates will be admitted under this scheme against 05% supernumerary seats in the above AICTE approved institutions/programmes being run on the University Campus.
- 2) **Tuition Fees Waiver Scheme:** The Scheme shall be applicable for the meritorious students of Economically Poor Background pursuing AICTE approved programmes in the UTDs/Institutes in which no Scholarship/Stipend is available. The Scheme shall be mandatory for all Institution approved by the AICTE.

3) Requirement and eligibility:

- (a) Sons and Daughters of Parents whose annual income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 8.00 lakh. The student will submit the Income Certificate duly signed by the Competent Authority.
- (b) The waiver is limited to Tuition Fees as approved by the State Level Fee Committee for Self-Financing Institutions and by the Government, for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. (c) All other fees except Tuition Fees shall have to be paid by the beneficiary.

4) Admission Procedure:

- (i) Under the scheme upto a maximum of 5% of "Approved Intake" per programme shall be available for this admission. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature. These supernumerary seats shall be available only to such programme(s) in an institution, where a minimum of 50% of "Approved Intake" are filled up.
- (ii) In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of candidates.
- (iii) Admission authority shall invite the applications under this category, make a separate merit list for this category and effect admission on the basis of the merit list so generated.
- (iv) Candidate, if any, simultaneously applying for more than one category viz. General/Reserved/Single Girl Child/J&K Students/Kashmiri Migrants/Kashmiri Non-Migrants (Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families living in Kashmir Valley)/Out Standing Sports Persons/NCC/NSS/KG to PG Scheme etc. other than Tuition Fees Waiver Quota are required to indicate in Admission Form in which category or categories the candidate gets benefit for admission.
- (v) Tuition Fees Waiver (TFW) admission shall be done parallel to the general admission.
- (vi) The student admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change the Institution/Programme under any circumstances.
- (vii) In the absence of any instruction/guideline, the instructions of the AICTE/Director General, Technical Education, Haryana in this regard be followed.
- (viii) The Tuition Fees Waiver Scheme will be reviewed every year in the AICTE approved programmes where a minimum of 50% of 'Approved Intake' are filed up during the previous year
- **4.10** Supernumerary Seats in BFA & MFA Programmes for Differently Abled Candidates: As per instructions issued by the Director, Social Justice & Empowerment Department, Haryana vide their letter No.22920-42/Clerk-4/DW/SJE/2020 dated 27.11.2020, regarding increasing number of seats in the discipline of Painting and Applied Art for Differently Abled persons with benchmark disabilities, the Admission Committee vide its Res. No.1 (ix) dated 14.7.2021, two (02) supernumerary seats

(Painting-01 & Applied Art-01) over and above the sanctioned seats have been created in Master of Fine Arts (MFA) and Bachelor of Fine Arts respectively in the Department of Fine Arts, KUK from the academic session 2021-22 for Differently Abled persons with benchmark disabilities as per norms given in Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

4.11 KG to PG Scheme:

1. Admission under KG to PG Scheme:

- (a) 15% supernumerary seats (except in the programmes where it is not allowed by the Regulatory Body), in UG/Integrated/PG programmes being run in the UTDs/Institutes of K.U. Campus will be given to all the students of USSMS.
- (b) The admission to the supernumerary seats in a programme will be made as per the eligibility criteria fixed for the UG/PG programmes as follows:

2. Admission in UG Programmes and Integrated Programmes:

- (a) Candidates should have passed the qualifying examination from USSMS and has studied in USSMS for a minimum duration of two (02) years.
- (b) Separate option for this scheme will be given in the application form and separate merit list will be prepared on the basis of the criteria as applicable to that programme. For the length of school education in USSMS, the weightage of 0.5 points per year will be given to the candidate and shall be added to the merit points of the candidate.
- (b) In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to other categories of candidates.
- (c) Student will have to submit a 'Certificate of Study' in USSMS duly signed by the Principal USSMS on prescribed proforma as per **Annexure-XIII.**

3. Admission in PG Programmes:

- (a) Candidates should have passed the qualifying examination from Kurukshetra University Campus and has studied in USSMS for a minimum duration of two (02) years.
- (b) Separate option for this scheme will be given in the application form and separate merit list will be prepared on the basis of the criteria as applicable to that programme.
- (c) In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to other categories of candidates.

Students will have to submit a 'Certificate of Study' in USSMS duly signed by the Principal USSMS on prescribed proforma as per **Annexure-XIII-A.**

Note: List of selected candidates for admission to 02 Supernumerary seats for outstanding sports persons in the programmes regulated by the AICTE/NCTE/PCI/BCI/RCI etc. will be displayed in the first list as these seats are to be considered within the sanctioned intake

CHAPTER - 5 WEIGHTAGES

For detail admission procedure, fee, seats intake, please visit www.techadmissions.gov.in and www.hstes.org.in. A separate prospectus will be published for the programmes run by ITTR and IIHS.
- 6.2 Admissions to B.A. Mass Communication, B.Sc. (Graphics & Animation), B.Sc. (Multimedia), B.Sc. (Printing and Packaging Tech.), M.Tech. (Applied Geology) 5 Yr. Integrated programme, Bachelor of Hotel Mgt. & Catering Technology (BHM & CT) and Master of Performing Arts (MPA) (Hons.) 5 Yr. Integrated Programme will be made on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying exam.
- 6.3 M.Pharmacy: Admissions to M. Pharmacy programme will be made on the basis of : (i) GPAT Score (ii) Remaining seats will be filled up on the basis of marks obtained in the Entrance Test. No other weightage will be given for preparing the Merit list.
- B.P.Ed.: After qualifying the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) admissions to B.P.Ed programme will be made on the basis of marks obtained in Entrance Test plus weightages as per rules.
- 6.5 M.P.Ed: After qualifying the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) admissions to M.P.Ed programme will be made on the basis of marks obtained in Entrance Test plus weightages as per rules.
- 6.6 Admissions to M.Tech. programmes will be made firstly on the basis of valid GATE score in the concerned subject and thereafter on the remaining vacant seats, if any, on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying Exam. No other weightage will be given for preparing the admission list.
- 6.7 Admission/counseling schedule for M.Ed. 2 Yr., Certificate Course of Sports Dietician-3 Months (Evening) and Certificate Course of Gym. & Aerobic Instructions (3 Months) courses will be notified by the Chairperson of the concerned Dept. later on.
- 6.8 Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma/P.G. Diploma: Admissions to Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Diploma/P.G. Diploma (except Basic Certificate Course in Japanese Language & Culture) programmes will be made on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying exam.
- 6.9 Basic Certificate Course in Japanese Language & Culture-3 Months (through online mode): Admission of the candidates will be made on the basis of their level in the Government Hierarchy.
- 6.10 Admissions to PG programmes (M.A./M.Sc./M.Com./M.Lib./B.Lib./ LL.B.3Yr./ B.A.LL.B. 5 Yr/ LL.M./BFA/MFA/MSW/MTTM/MHM&CT/MCA/MBA 2 Yr./MBA 5 Yr. Integrated Programme/ BBA (Hons.)/M.Ed. Special Education-V.I./B.Ed Special Education-V.I. etc.) being run in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes on the basis of merit points based on marks secured in entrance test and/or Group Discussion/Personal Interview/Practical Examination, wherever applicable as per point titled "SCHEME/PATTERN OF ENTRANCE TEST/GD/INTERVIEW ETC.", unless mentioned otherwise in the criteria for that programme.
- 6.11 When the list of applicants, who have appeared in the Entrance Test, is exhausted i.e. no student who have appeared in the Entrance Test is interested to take admission in a programme, then admission in that programme in that Department/Institute will be made on the basis of merit of qualifying exam for that programme out of applicants for that programme.
- 6.12 If no applicant is interested for the admission in a programme, then the Department/ Institute may invite fresh applications for that programme by advertising the vacant seats on the University/Institute website or through other means of public notification.

The candidate having higher Merit Points shall be ranked higher in the merit list for admission.

Tie-Resolution Criteria

Wherever two or more candidates have secured equal merit points, these tie(s) is/are resolved in accordance with the following criteria:

1. If Merit Points do not break the tie, then based on the Total Percentage of Marks/CGPA obtained in Class 12 or equivalent, the candidates having higher percentage of marks is to be ranked higher.

- 2. If the Total Percentage of Marks obtained in Class 12 or equivalent does not break the tie, then based on the Total Percentage of Marks/CGPA obtained in Class 10, the candidates having higher percentage of marks is to be ranked higher.
- 3. If the Aggregate/Total Percentage of Marks obtained in Class 10 does not break the tie, then based on Date of Birth, the candidate senior/ older in age is to be ranked higher.
- 6.13 Weightage of 5 marks shall be given in the programs in which admission will be made on the basis of 10 + 2 or equivalent to the holder of Certificate of Merit for NSS as per guidelines issued by the State Government.
- 6.14 On the basis of the merit of the candidate, the seat allotment process will be carried out and Merit List of various programmes as per the schedule shall be displayed on the portal. The selected candidate will have to report to the Chairperson/Director of the concerned Department/Institute for document verification as per specified schedule.
- 6.15 If a candidate applies in more than one programme his/her name may appear in the Merit lists of more than one programme. The candidate is advised to choose only one programme to remit the admission fee because a candidate may not be given the admission in more than one programme (except evening programmes), If a candidate has been offered the seat in a Merit List of a programme and he/she does not remit the admission fee for that programmes, his/her name shall not be considered for subsequent list of that programme. However, he/she will only be considered for final list of that programme subject to marking online attendance with requisite fees.
- 6.16 If a candidate is offered the seat in the subsequent list in any other programme and he/she fills the fee in that programme, it would automatically result in the forfeiture of the seat accepted by the candidate in the earlier list.
- 6.17 Three Merit Lists (i.e. First, Second and Third) shall be displayed and admission will be made as per above procedure specified. If seats remain vacant in any programme, the Final List and Waiting List shall be prepared as per the procedure given below:

6.18 Final List:

- (a) After the Third List, the interested applicants who are otherwise eligible and whose names either have not appeared in any of the list(s) or have appeared in the list but failed to deposit their dues, must mark their attendance online by paying fee of Rs.100/- on the admission portal as per notified schedule. The category wise Final List will be prepared and displayed on the admission portal as per schedule from the pool of the candidates who have marked their attendance for final list. The candidates who do not mark their attendance for final list will only be considered for admission against any subsequent vacant seat, if there is no candidate in the waiting list drawn from the pool of the candidates who have marked their attendance for final list.
- (b) Benefit of reservation will be given to all reserved category upto final list as per Reservation Policy. In case at the time of display of final list the reserved seats of various categories other than SC category, remain vacant and no eligible candidate of the reserved category are available, these vacant seats will be filled up by Haryana General Category (HGC), in case no candidate of HGC is available it will be offer to the candidate of All India Category.

After display of Final List, if any seat(s) remain vacant or fall vacant due to drop out by the admitted students, the vacated seat(s) first be filled up from the candidates of respective category on merit basis from the waiting list. If no corresponding reserved category, other than SC category, candidate is available, then it will be filled up by HGC by the Chairperson from the waiting list drawn from the pool of the candidates who have marked their attendance for final list. In case no candidate of HGC is available, it will be offered to the candidates of All India Category.

6.19 Admission Procedure for TFW Scheme

- (i) In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of candidates.
- (ii) Admission authority shall invite the applications under this category; make a separate merit list for this category and effect admission on the basis of the merit list so generated.
- (iii) Candidate, if any, simultaneously applying for more than one category viz. General/Reserved/Single Girl Child/J&K Students/Kashmiri Migrants/Kashmiri Non-

Migrants (Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families living in Kashmir Valley)/Out Standing Sports Persons/NCC/NSS/KG to PG Scheme etc. other than Tuition Fees Waiver (TFW) Quota is required to indicate in Admission Form in which category or categories the candidate gets benefit for admission.

- (iv) Tuition Fees Waiver (TFW) admission shall be done parallel to the general admission.
- (v) The student admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change the Institution/Programme under any circumstances.
- (vi) In the absence of any instruction/guideline, the instructions of the AICTE/Director General, Technical Education, and Haryana in this regard be followed.

6.20 Note:

- (i) In case, in any examination CGPA is given, then the candidate will have to provide the conversion formula to compute percentage of marks from CGPA (Document supporting the conversion formula from the concerned university/board should be uploaded). In absence of conversion formula, by default, the CGPA shall be multiplied by 9. In case CGPA as well as marks obtained, both are provided then CGPA shall be considered to compute percentage of marks
- (ii) Admissions shall be made on the basis of information furnished by the candidate and subsequent verification of documents/testimonials at the time of admission. If at any point of time, any candidate is found to have supplied false information, certificates, documents etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed some information in his/her Application Form, he/she shall be liable to be debarred from admission. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage, his/her admission will be cancelled ab intio and all fees and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited. The University/Institute may also take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate and his/her guardian.
- (iv) List of selected candidates for admission to 02 Supernumerary seats for outstanding sports persons in the programmes regulated by the AICTE/NCTE/PCI/BCI/RCI etc. will be displayed in the first list as these seats are to be considered within the sanctioned intake.
- (v) In case of Supernumerary seats under KG to PG Scheme admission in UG Programmes and Integrated Programmes separate, separate option for this scheme will be given in the application form and separate merit list will be prepared on the basis of the criteria as applicable to that programme. For the length of school education in USSMS, the weightage of 0.5 points per year will be given to the candidate and shall be added to the merit points of the candidate.
- (vi) **Eligibility Certificate:** The eligibility for admission to various courses will be checked by the Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute concerned at their own level and after provisional admission, the Registration Branch will check all documents of admitted candidates except State Universities/Board of Haryana.
 - The candidates, who have passed their lower examination from any University except State Universities/Board of Haryana, are required to obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the Registration Branch before they are admitted provisionally by the Department/Institute concerned. For Eligibility Certificate, the prescribed form can be had from the concerned Department/Institute. Application Form alongwith original certificates should be submitted to the Branch Officer (Regn. Branch) for issuing the Eligibility Certificate. No such students will be given even provisional admission without obtaining Eligibility Certificate.
- (vii) Foreign Students: Candidates who have passed lower/qualifying examinations from foreign Universities or Boards are required to submit Eligibility Certificate. The Eligibility Certificate will be issued by the Registration Branch on checking the required documents, such as student's visa and original documents of a Foreign student. No Foreign student will be given even provisional admission without obtaining Eligibility Certificate.

6.22 INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTRANCE TEST

- 1. The candidates should check the scheme and syllabus on the university portal for the entrance test of the programme for which he/she has applied for.
- 2. The Admit Cards for the Entrance Test will be generated through the University website by the concerned Department/Institute. The candidate can download the same before the date of conduct of Entrance Test. Roll No. and the Centre of the Entrance Test will be mentioned on the Admit Card. However, if any candidate due to any reason, can not get his/her Admit Card up to two days before the Entrance Test, he/she must contact the office of the Chairperson/Director of the concerned Department/Institute. Such candidates must bring two recent passport size photographs duly attested by a Gazetted Officer or Head of the Department/Institute last attended by him/her to obtain duplicate Admit Card, 1-2 days before the Entrance Test. No Admit Card will be issued on the day of Entrance Test.
- 3. Candidates must not write or change any entry made in the Admit Card after it has been received by them.
- 4. Candidates must bring the Admit Cards with them at the time of Entrance Test. Without Admit Card, the candidates will not be allowed to appear in the Entrance Test.
- 5. Candidates should reach the Examination Hall well before time and should occupy their seats in the Examination Hall atleast half an hour before the examination starts.
- 6. Candidates will be given a sealed Entrance Test Booklet containing questions as well as the OMR answer sheet 15 minutes before the start of the test. During these 15 minutes, the candidates should read the instructions and fill all the required particulars in the test booklet and OMR sheet.
- 7. Candidates must sign with a ball-point pen at the appropriate place on the front page of the question booklet as well as on the OMR answer-sheet.
- 8. Candidates should open the paper seal of the Test Booklet only when they are asked to do so by the Invigilator.
- 9. The OMR Answer Sheet must be returned to the invigilator before leaving the Examination Hall and the carbon copy of the OMR Sheet and Question Booklet may be carried by the candidates.
- 10. The candidates are advised to go through the instructions carefully given on the OMR Answer Sheet at the time of Entrance Test.
- 11. Candidates should bring their own good quality blue/black ball-point pens for making entries in the OMR Answer-Sheet. These will not be supplied by the University.

- 12. Candidates are advised not to fold, put any stray mark or do any rough work on the OMR answer sheet. However, the candidate can do rough work on the last page of Question Paper Booklet.
- 13. All the entries in the OMR Answer Sheet should be made strictly according to the instructions given to the candidates in the Examination Hall.
- 14. Use of books, papers, slide rules, log tables, cellular phones, calculators, pagers, digital diaries etc. will not be allowed in the Examination Hall.
- 15. If any candidate is found guilty of breach of any rules mentioned in the Prospectus or guilty of using unfair means, he/she will be liable to be punished by the competent authority of the University.
- 16. The candidates will be allowed to appear in the Entrance Test provisionally, subject to fulfilling the prescribed eligibility conditions/criteria given in the Prospectus. The candidates shall have no right to claim admission to any course merely due to their appearing in the Entrance Test.
- 17. To avoid impersonation, Videography of the candidates appearing in the Entrance Test and/or interview may be done by the University.

- 7.1 Download HBI-23 and read it carefully to ensure your eligibility and acquaint with the requirements for submission of Online Application Form, no separate information will be sent to any candidate in this regard. HBI can be downloaded from 'Admission' section available on the website of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra: www.kuk.ac.in or from the admission portal https://iums.kuk.ac.in/anon_admissionHome.htm. Candidates have to apply for Admissions 2023 online ONLY by accessing the website/admission portal. Application Forms other than online mode will not be accepted in any case. Only one application for a programme is to be submitted by a candidate. More than one application i.e. multiple application forms submitted for the same programme by a candidate will be rejected.
- 7.2 The candidate having compartment in any semester will not be considered for admission.
- 7.3 Programs in which the qualifying examination is 10 + 2 or equivalent, the candidate who have not passed the 10 + 2 or equivalent examinations will not be considered.
- 7.4 Programs in which the qualifying examination is graduation or equivalent, the candidate, if admitted, whose result of qualifying exam is not declared, will submit the result of qualifying exam by 30th September, 2023. If the candidate is not able to provide the proof of passing the qualifying exam (i.e. Consolidated Marks Sheet of qualifying exam) by stipulated date, his/her provisional admission will be cancelled ab-initio and no fee will be refunded.
- 7.5 Candidates are advised to upload all the relevant documents and testimonials along with their application form for ascertaining their Date of Birth, Eligibility, Category as well as for calculating the Merit for Admission Purpose. Before starting to fill up the online application, keep ready with you the following details, and images of documents (size of image of any document should not exceed 1024 kb):

Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a University in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit a certificate of bonafide resident of Haryana as per guidelines given in **Appendix-A**
- n) Image of scanned Valid GATE/GPAT Score/ Rank Card, if applicable.
- o) Image of scanned Employer's Certificate in case of employee, if applicable.
- p) Image of Migration Certificate and proof of current residence of Kashmiri Migrants.

 - (i) **Private Candidates:** Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidates should submit their character certificate duly signed by a First Class Magistrate.
 - (ii) Candidates who have recently qualified: Candidates who have passed/appeared in the qualifying examination in current session must submit Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended as per specimen given in **Annexure-I**.
- 7.6 The candidates must ensure that they have obtained the relevant certificate(s) from the appropriate competent authority approved and notified by Govt. of Haryana and that is according to the format as specified in the HBI.
- 7.7 It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to upload all necessary documents/ certificates/ testimonials/fees with the application form. Discrepancy, if any, shall not be communicated to the candidates by the department/institute.
- 7.8 Not uploading of required documents will be considered as incomplete application form. The same will be identified and rejected for admission by the Admission Committee of the Department.
- 7.9 Correct Photograph and Signature must be uploaded by the candidates as the facility for correction in images will not be given.
- 7.10 How to apply: Visit the official website www.kuk.ac.in or admission porta https://iums.kuk.ac.in/anon_admissionHome.htm and follow the following procedure:
 - 1. Click on 'New Registration' Tab.
 - 2. Choose your State preference from two available options Haryana State and Other State
 - 3. Proceed by entering you PPP or Aadhar Number, if available.
 - 4. Fill basic details like email, mobile number, name, password etc.
 - 5. OTP message will be sent to your registered email I'd and mobile number. Applicant is advised to fill his/her own email I'd (create the same if not available) carefully since the password shall be sent to the applicant's email I'd.
 - 6. Now login using user I'd (registered email I'd) and password.
 - 7. Upload your photo and signature to start the application form
 - 8. Read the Guidelines carefully.
 - 9. Select one or more programme in which you want to apply.
 - 10. Fill the Personal, Address, Weightage (if any), Supernumerary seats, category, education and other details etc.
 - 11. Attach the required documents as per your selection.
 - 12. Review your Form and if all is ok then submit the same. The candidate must ensure that all entries have been filled correctly and all necessary documents have been uploaded before submitting the form. Once submitted, it will not be edited.
 - 13. Now pay the application fee through online mode. Online application fee/admission fee for admissions to various programmes shall be deposited by the candidates through all online modes (except debit card/credit card) like Net banking/UPI/RTGS-NEFT/CSC (Common Services Centre) Wallet by using online payment gate way during filling of application forms and at the time of admission. Online application fee once paid shall not be refunded (full or partial) under any circumstances. The candidates are required to check the status of

fee payment at Kurukshetra University website and if the status is "OK", the candidate will be able to take the printout of Confirmation Page. In case, the fee payment status is not "OK", it means that transaction is cancelled and the amount will be refunded as per University Rules after completion of admission process. The Application Processing Fee of a programme has been fixed of Rs. 1000/- (Rs.250/- for SC/BC/Differently Abled candidates of Haryana only). If a student applies for more than one programme, he/she will have to deposit fee of Rs.400/-(Rs.100/- for SC/BC/Differently Abled candidates of Haryana only) for each programme separately.

- 7.11 No programme will be started if the strength of admitted students is less than ten, and no option will be started if the strength is less than five. All the Departments shall notify the options in each programme with number of seats well before the admission and the options will be allotted on merit basis.
- 7.12 Candidates having compartment in the qualifying examination shall not be allowed admission in the concerned programme except BHM&CT.
- 7.13 Any legal dispute relating to admission of students will be subject to Courts at Kurukshetra or Courts having jurisdiction in Kurukshetra.
- **7.14** The Kurukshetra University can make use of the data generated, for the purpose of research and analysis.
- 7.15 KUK does not take any responsibility for the candidates not being able to submit their Application Forms by the last date and time on account of any reason beyond the control of the KUK. Candidates can check their fee status after login to their account and can download/print the receipt.
- 7.16 The Chairpersons/Directors of the University Teaching Departments/Institutes to ensure that ineligible candidate(s) is/are not allowed admission in the Dept./Institute and for this every precaution must be taken. Responsibility for any wrong/irregular admission or admission allowed on the basis of fake certificate, in contravention of the Ordinance, if any, will rest entirely with the Chairperson/Director of the University Teaching Departments/Institutes concerned; admission of such students may be treated as cancelled ab-initio. In case any student files civil suit in any Judicial Court against the orders declaring him/her ineligible, the said civil suit is required to be defended by the Department/Institutes concerned.
- 7.17 Every student must follow University rules and regulations in maintaining discipline on the Campus. If a student is found involved in any act/s of indiscipline, unlawfulness or misbehavior and is punished as per University rules, all dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited and no refund will be allowed.
- 7.18 Nothing contained in this HBI should be construed to convey sanction or be cited as an authority for which University Regulations in Calendars Vol. I, II and the relevant rules in Calendar Vol. III alone are applicable.
- 7.19 If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character/past behaviour/antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any programme of study in the University in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the university. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period. If the Hostel authorities are not satisfied with the character/past behaviour/antecedents of a student, Hostel accommodation may be refused to him/her in order to ensure discipline and peaceful atmosphere of the Hostels.
- 7.20 State-wise List of Fake Universities and Examinations of Board not recognized for the purpose of higher studies: List of Fake Universities declared by UGC and Examinations of Board not recognized for the purpose of higher studies by the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani is available on their websites. Before finalizing the admissions the updated list of recognized examinations of the UGC and the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani is required to be consulted www.ugc.ac.in/page/Fake-Universities.aspx and www.bseh.org.in by the Chairpersons/Directors of the concerned Departments/Institutes..
- 7.21 Distance Degrees which are not approved by the Joint Committee of UGC, DEB and AICTE/DEB shall not be considered eligible for admission to M. Tech. programmes.
- 7.22 As per instructions issued by the Principal Secretary, Govt. of Haryana, Higher Education Department, Chandigarh letter No.18/172-2016 UNP (4) dated 30.06.2017, the Committee in its

- meeting held on 02.08.2017 has resolved that maternity leave upto 45 days will be granted to such women students who are studying in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes and affiliated/maintained Colleges in all the programmes except M.P.Ed., B.P.Ed. D.P.Ed. and C.P.Ed.to complete their education without any gap/hindrance. The maternity leave to women students will be granted by the competent authority as per University Rules.
- 7.23 Each admitted student shall have to furnish Self Declaration by him/her as per specimen given Annexure-X and his/her Parent/Guardian as per specimen given at Annexure-XI that he/she was never found guilty of ragging and shall not indulge in any act of ragging at the time of opening of Campus and mark their attendance physically in the class room. At the time of admission every candidate shall be required to give an undertaking of good conduct & behavior and not to indulge in ragging. If a candidate after his/her admission is found indulging in any kind of ragging, his/her admission is liable to be canceled.
- **7.24** No migration or transfer will be allowed from a College to the University Department and vice-versa.
- 7.25 Candidates after taking admission in any programme on the Campus other than an Evening Programme can also take admission in Evening Certificate/Diploma programmes.
- **7.26** For information regarding Syllabus of the programmes, Library services, admission to Hostels, fee concession, scholarships etc. the candidates are advised to contact the Chairperson/Director of the Department/ Institute concerned.
- 7.27 If a student fails to attend his/her classes continuously for seven days from the date of commencement of the classes or from the date of admission, whichever is later, his/her admission shall be cancelled.
- 7.28 If a student remains absent from the class for 14 days or more in a month his/her name will be struck off from the rolls and his/her parents will also be informed.
- 7.29 The candidate shall have to fill up Group Personal Insurance of Students Proposal/Nomination Proforma after physically opening of the Campus as per Annexure XVIII.
- **7.30** Each admitted student whose result of qualifying exam is awaited shall have to furnish an undertaking as per specimen given at **Annexure-XIX** that he/she admitted at his/her own instance as his/her result is still awaited. If he/she is not able to pass qualifying exam, he/she will be responsible for the incidental consequences regarding eligibility conditions as per rules. He/she will also not claim any refund of fee etc.
- 7.31 Unless otherwise provided, a person who is eligible to take admission as per conditions laid down in the concerned Ordinance, can pursue two academic programmes simultaneously through Distance Education or Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or upto two ODL/Online programmes or combination of distance and regular modes, from the same or different Universities/Institutions duly approved by the UGC/AICTE/Central Government/State Governments, in various combinations, viz;
 - (i) A student can pursue two full time academic programmes in physical mode provided that in such cases, class timings for one programme do not overlap with the class timings of the other programme.
 - (ii) A student can pursue two academic programmes, one in full time physical mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or upto two ODL/online programme simultaneously.
- **Note 1:** The above programme(s) shall be applicable only to the students pursuing academic programmes other than Ph.D. programme.
- **Note 2:** The time table of two full time academic programmes in physical mode overlap with each other in all the programmes (except evening programmes) therefore, hence it is not possible for a candidate to pursue two full time academic programmes in physical mode.
- 7.32 The scheme, syllabi and instructions for the entrance test can be seen from the university website www.kuk.ac.in

8.1 Introduction

These rules define the procedure for the admission of international students to various programmes of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. These rules are based on general guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Association of Indian Universities and Statutory/Regulatory directives issued from time to time.

8.2 The Office

The Office of Advisor, International Student shall provide necessary guidance for admission of foreign students to the various programmes run in the University. All correspondence related to international students should be addressed to the Office of the Advisor, International Students, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra – 136119 (Haryana) India.

8.3 International Students

- i) Foreign Student: Students holding passports issued by foreign countries including Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) who have acquired the nationality of foreign countries.
- ii) Persons of Indian Origin (PIO): PIO shall mean the Persons who are citizens of other countries (except Pakistan and Bangladesh) who at any time held an Indian Passport, or who or either of his parents of any of his grandparents was a citizen of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Sec 2 (b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (Act No. 57 of 1955).
- iii) Non-Resident Indians (NRIs): Only those Non Resident Indian students who have studied and passed the qualifying examinations from schools or colleges in foreign countries will be treated as international students. This will include the students studying in the schools or colleges situated in the foreign countries even if affiliated to the Boards of Secondary, Higher Secondary Education or Universities located in India, but will not include students studying in those schools and colleges (situated in India) and affiliated to the Boards Secondary Higher Secondary Examinations from Boards or Universities located in foreign countries as external students and Dependents of NRI studying in India will not merit the status of international students.

8.4 Documents Required For Admission Of International Students

i) VISA: All the international students shall require a student VISA endorsed to the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra for joining the full time programmes. Foreign students admitted to Kurukshetra University shall obtain a STUDENT VISA in the name of Kurukshetra University on the basis of admission within one Month from the date of admission for the prescribed duration of the programme. A copy of this VISA is to be submitted in the office of Advisor, International Students, Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra.

Students wishing to join a research programme will require a research VISA endorsed to the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The VISA should be valid for prescribed duration of the programme.

VISA is not required for NRI students.

ii) Certificate from Association of Indian Universities (AIU): The programme on which eligibility is relied upon must be included in the list of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). In case the University/Board is not included in the said list, the candidate has to obtain and submitEquivalence Certificate to this effect from the Association of Indian Universities.

Submission of Equivalence Certificate from AIU is mandatory for foreign nationals. The AIU address is given below:

iii) Prior Security Clearance: All international students desiring to undertake any research work or join a Ph.D or M. Phil. Programme must obtain prior security clearance from the Ministry of Home

- Affairs and the approval of Department of Secondary and Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and this must be on the research VISA endorsed to the university or institution concerned.
- **iv)** Attestation by concerned Embassy/High Commission/Consulate: All attestation must be done by the concerned Embassy/High Commission/Consulate of the relevant country in India. The document without attestation shall be summarily rejected.
- v) Attested Transcripts: Candidate applying from their own country should get their transcripts of certificates attested by the concerned accredited authorized Government Agency and also duly certified by the Indian Embassy or Consulate as the case may be Attested copies of Senior School Certificate/Bachelor's Degree/Master's Degree or equivalent thereof should be attached.
- vi) Character Certificate: A Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended alongwith its attestation by the concerned Embassy/High Commission/Consulate should be submitted.
- **vii) Medical Certificate**: All the international students have to undergo the medical examination and get the medical fitness certificate. As per government rules all international students entering India on student VISA have to be tested for HIV and will not be given admission if found to be positive.
- viii) Registration in Foreign Regional Registration Office (FRRO): Within 14 days of arrival in India, the international student has to register his name with the police in the Foreigner Regional Registration Office (FRRO) of the local police. For this the following documents shall be submitted by the admitted students to the Office of the Advisor, International Students:
 - a) Photocopy of the Passport
 - b) Photocopy of the VISA
 - c) Proof of Residence
 - d) Proof of Admission
 - e) Four Passport Size photographs
 - f) HIV Report.
- **8.5 Eligibility Qualifications**: International students should fulfill the minimum eligibility condition prescribed for admission as per the requirements of the programme applied for. However, such candidates shall NOT be required to undergo the admission entrance test.

8.6 Supernumerary Seats for International Students:

- i) 15% supernumerary seats shall be available for international students in all the programmes run by the University at its campus including the AICTE approved programmes.
- ii) Candidates to the Supernumerary seats shall be required to fulfill the eligibility criteria for the programme applied. However, such candidates shall NOT be required to undergo the admission entrance test.
- iii) Candidates under this category shall be required to fulfill all/any other conditions as may be prescribed and notified by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra from time to time.
- iv) Candidates seeking admission under Supernumerary seats will have to apply on a prescribed form which will be available from the office of the Advisor, International Students, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra or this form can be downloaded from University website (www.kuk.ac.in).
- v) This application form should be submitted to the office of the Advisor, International Students, alongwith the attested/certified copies of all requisite documents mentioned in the form.
- vi) In case applications are received in excess against the allotted seats in particular programme, inter se merit will be prepared.

8.7 Fee Structure for Supernumerary Seats:

The revised tuition/admission fee structure for Govt. funded international students is shown in Table- I. Also Registration fees of every international student only once will be Rs. 20000/-. Hostel fees will be Rs. 5000/- per month excluding electricity and meal charges.

8.12 Cancellation of Admission

The admitted students should note that his admission stands automatically cancelled if:

- 1. He/She fails to obtain long term Student/Research VISA in the name of the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra only from the Indian Embassy in his/her country on the basis of the letter of provisional admission.
- 2. He/She fails to produce Original Statement of marks/grade point average certificate of the last qualifying examination or equivalent thereof at the time of admission.
- 3. He/She is found to be medically unfit.
- 4. He/She fails to fulfill any condition of eligibility for admission to the Programme.

- 1. Every student is required to attend classes regularly. If a student attends classes less than the required number i.e. 75%, then he/she can be detained from appearing in the examinations as per University Rules. The minimum attendance required for each Semester/year for various programmes unless otherwise provided in the Ordinance of a programme is 75% of the full programme of lectures delivered in each Paper, Practical and Tutorials separately.
- 2. A student should always wear his/her ID card around his/her neck on the Campus. The same should be shown when identity proof is required by the University Officials/Security Staff.
- 3. No student will be allowed to enter any office, hostel, library, auditorium, administrative & examination blocks, etc., if he/she fails to show his/her University Identity Card. Students will be allowed to attend cultural programmes, sports events, film shows or other programmes of the University only when they wear their valid ID card. Students must observe discipline during any such programme and they must obey instructions of the teachers on proctorial duty and/or security officials.
- 4. All the students must fill in the required information correctly in the Students' Information Form. The address and contact numbers of parents should be correct so that they can be contacted in case of any emergency.
- 5. If a student gets accommodation allotted in his/her name in a hostel and that student allows some other person(s) to stay in his/her allotted room and/or to take meals, in that case the admission of both the students, i.e. the allottee and the illegal occupant, shall be cancelled from the Department/Institute as well as from the hostel without assigning any reason.
- 6. Non-residents of university hostels will not be allowed to stay in the hostels without prior permission of the competent authority. Strict disciplinary action would be taken against the student(s) who violate(s) this rule.
- 7. Bonafide student, desirous of bringing/keeping his/her vehicle in the University Campus, would be required to submit self-attested photocopy of the Registration Certificate (RC) of his/her vehicle and the driving license to the Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute and to the Warden of the hostel concerned. The student will be issued a Permit in the form of a Sticker for his/her vehicle after submission of copy of Registration Certificate to the Chief Security Officer through Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute. No vehicle, other than the permitted one, will be allowed entry in the University Campus. The University has the right to deny to issue vehicle pass sticker to any student, if not satisfied or deems fit, otherwise.
- 8. Students are not allowed to honk horn(s) of their vehicles or to play loud music in their vehicles in the University premises.
- 9. No vehicle with black film(s) will be allowed entry in the University premises.
- 10. Students must observe maximum speed limit of 30 km per hour while driving their permitted vehicle on the campus.
- 11. Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra is a Ragging Free Campus. All students must follow the University guidelines regarding Anti-Ragging appended in the HBI. To report incident(s) of any kind of ragging, helpline numbers are displayed at major places on the campus and/on the University website also.
- 12. All students should behave decently with female students, teachers and employees. No student should involve in any incident of eve-teasing. Anyone found indulging in such activity shall be liable to stringent disciplinary action. The University strictly follows its policy of zero tolerance towards eve-teasing and act(s) of sexual harassment.
- 13. Students should use decent language with everyone on the campus.
- 14. The University property should not be harmed in any manner. If a student is found damaging the University property, strict action will be taken against him/her.
- 15. Use of alcohol, tobacco and drugs in any form is strictly prohibited on the University Campus. Every student must observe these instructions on the Campus failing which strict action will be taken against him/her to the extent of expulsion from the University and the programme.

- 16. Every student must follow University rules and regulations in maintaining discipline on the campus. If a student is found involved in any act/s of indiscipline, unlawfulness or misbehaviour then he/she will be punished as per University rules.
- 17. Campus Students' may take up their collective demands with the Students' Council. No student is allowed to disturb the academic atmosphere of the campus. If anyone is found disrupting classes or instigating students to disrupt classes/office work/administrative work, vitiating academic and administrative setup and/or attempt to force upon the authorities, then such activity will be considered serious indisciplinary act and the student(s) will be punished accordingly. In the absence of Students' Council, students can submit or report their requests/grievances to the Dean Students' Welfare.
- 18. University has a mechanism to redress the grievances of its students through Students' Grievances Redressal Cell. A student can submit his/her complaint/grievance to the Dean Students' Welfare, Convener of the Cell, via e-mail dsw@kuk.ac.in or in writing mentioning his/her name, class, roll number, department/hostel & phone number to the office of Dean Students' Welfare, KUK. Student can seek their grievances related to their Department(s), redressal in the Department Students Grievances Cell by contacting Chairperson of the Department. However, collective students' grievances/demands can only be dealt as mentioned in the Point No. 17.
- 19. Students are advised not to hold any rally or protest near the University administrative block and in front of the Vice-Chancellor's office, in particular. They should take up the issue, if any, first with the Chairperson/Director/Principal/ Warden/Chief Warden and then with the Dean Students' Welfare.
- 20. Students must obey instructions of the teacher-in-charge(s) while on a tour/ trip/ field training/ Industrial training, etc. All safety norms, as prescribed in the UGC Safety Regulations, should be followed by students on and off the campus.
- 21. All the students must observe silence in the library. They must not use mobile phones in the library.
- 22. One should not write or paste posters on the walls and window panes of the University buildings. Any poster/hoarding found pasted/fixed/hanged at any place, other than the prescribed place, will attract severe punishment under the Defacement Act of Public Property.
- 23. Students are expected to keep the campus neat and clean. The use of polythene is strictly banned on the campus.

10.1 ADJUSTMENT OF FEE

If a candidate after having deposited fee for admission in one course joins another course in another Teaching Dept./Institute in the same session, as mentioned below, and is permitted to withdraw his/her candidature, fee/funds except admission fee already deposited by him/her for the course from which he/she has withdrawn, shall be adjusted/refunded against the fee/funds of the course he/she joins subject to the condition that the difference, if any, shall be paid by the candidate:

- (i) from a general course to another general course;
- (ii) from a general course to a self-financing course or vice-versa.
- (iii) from a self-financing course to another self-financing course.

Application for adjustment of fee is as per Annexure-XV.

10.2 REFUND OF FEE

If a candidate withdraws from the course/programme in which he/she was admitted in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes/Colleges affiliated/maintained by the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, the fee to the candidate will be refunded as per following rules:

- (a) In case of demise of a candidate during the period as per point no. 1, 2 and 3 above, the application of withdrawal of admission and refund of fee is to be submitted by the parents/guardian of the candidate and the fee will be refunded without any deductions.
- (b) Fee will be refunded to the eligible candidate who are covered the above criteria given at Sr. No. 1 to 4 within 30 working days from the date of closure of admission of that academic session.
- (c) In the courses, which are also governed by AICTE rules, refund of fee will be as per AICTE academic calendar 2023-24.
- (d) Application for withdrawal of admission and refund of fee is as per Annexure-XIV.

11.1 Benefits of Fee for Candidates of Haryana Belonging to The Reserved Category

There is a Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of GOI for welfare of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category. As per letter No.3/44-2012 Sch.(2) dated 18.06.2013 of the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula. such students whose parents/guardian income is up to Rs. 2.50 lac per annum, are eligible for benefits under the said scheme. The benefits include enrollment/registration, tuition, games, union, library, magazine, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsorily payable by the student to the institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution money, security deposit are, however, excluded. For students admitted under this scheme, the application form has to be submitted by the students to the concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute.

Note:

- 1. An income declaration shall be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardian. Employed parents are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources; they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.
- 2. No fee will be charged by the University from the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category, whose parent's Income is upto 2.50 lac per annum. They shall be admitted during the academic session 2023-24 as per instructions of the Director Higher Education, Haryana and the Director General, Technical Education Department, Panchkula, Haryana. However, as per instructions dated 01.09.2018 of the Director, Welfare of SC/BC Classes Department Haryana, Chandigarh, the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category who after verification of record by the office are found eligible for the PMS Scholarship, shall have to submit an undertaking in the Fee Section of the Accounts Branch that they will deposit their fee immediately to the institution as soon as they receive the Scholarship in their bank account.
- 3. Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste category who are eligible for Post Matric Scholarship Scheme should get their Saving Bank Account linked with Aadhaar Number to get transferred the funds in their respective bank accounts.
- 4. Students who are eligible for Scheduled Caste and Backward Class Scholarship(s) as the case may be, may apply online on the dates which will be announced/published in the newspapers by the State Govt./Funding Agencies.
- 11.2 Free Education for Dependent Children of Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs)

No fee/dues will be charged from the dependent children of Leprosy Affected Persons and education in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes will be free for them.

- 11.3 Tuition Fees Concession
- 11.3.1 For Budgeted Course

Tuition Fee concessions

(a) Full Tuition Fee Concessions may be given to deserving students by the Chairpersons/Director/Principal of the Departments/Institutes/ School up to 10% of the total number of students on roll in each class/department on the day of final date of admission.

The Vice-Chancellor may, in deserving cases and on the recommendation of the Chairperson of the Department concerned, grant additional fee concessions upto 10 students provided that not more than one such additional fee concession shall be awarded in any class in a Department.

- (b) Tuition Fee concessions may be allowed to two children of the same parents at the following rates:-
 - (i) The eldest to pay Full tuition fee.
 - (ii) The younger (only one) to pay Half tuition fee.
- (c) Tuition Fee concession to University employees and their dependents:
 - (i) Full time working/retired University employees permitted to pursue studies by the University will be exempted from payment of Tuition Fee. Provided in case of individuals who fail in

the examinations for which they are permitted or whose conduct is reported as unsatisfactory or who do not take proper interest in the office work, the concession will be discontinued.

- (ii) Dependent Children of the University employee/Retired University employee.
- (iii) A child of a University employee who is in service & joins a Department/Institute or Directorate of Distance Education for higher studies will be entitled to tuition Fee Concession on the basis of his own income and that of his father taken together.
- (iv) Younger sisters and Younger brothers of a member of the University staff living with them and wholly dependent upon the University employee.
- (v) The wife of a University employee who is not working, but is studying in the University Teaching Department or has enrolled herself with the Directorate of Distance Education will be granted tuition Fee Concession as available to dependent children or younger sisters or brothers of an employee.
- (vi) A candidate who is perusing two degree Programmes in the University shall be given tuition fee concession for the programme, where the fee is less.
- (vii) Fee Concession for Students (Indian/International) in Evening Courses: The students (Indian/International) who have already admitted in University Teaching Departments/ Institutes of this University and if he/she takes admission in any evening course, then he/she will be charged half of tuition fee at the time of admission. Further, the fees/funds i.e. Building Fund, Continuation Fee, Medical Fee, Magazine Fee, Student Aid Fund, Group Insurance Scheme, Film Fee, Alumni Fee, and Kurukshetra University Student Council Fund will not be charged from them for the Evening Courses.
- (d) The children of serving military personnel of Haryana upto the rank of an Non Commissioned Officer (N.C.O.) or of military personnel of Haryana killed or incapacitated wholly or partly during the war, shall be allowed Full Tuition Fee Concession.
- (e) Blind students of Haryana may be granted Full Fee Concession (including tuition fee and other fee and funds)

Note:-These concessions shall be admissible only to those studying in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes/Directorate of Distance Education.

11.3.2 For SFS Courses

No fee concession will be allowed in SFS courses w.e.f. the session 2022-23 in view of the financial viability except Group-C and Group-D employees who will continue to get 50% tuition fee concession as per past practice.

However, continuing students who are already enrolled and getting fee concession will continue to get 50% tuition fee concession as per past practice.

11.4 COVID Support Scheme:

- (i) The name of the scheme will be 'COVID SUPPORT SCHEME' (COSS).
- (ii) The scheme shall be for the orphans resident of Haryana who have lost their both the parents/single earning parent/adopted parents due to Corona Virus during the Corona period from March, 2020 onwards.
- (iii) The scheme is initially proposed for fresh students for the current academic session for On-Campus courses.
- (iv) Full fee concession (tuition fee and funds) will be given to On-Campus students in the budgeted courses and half fee concession (tuition fee and funds) in courses running under Self-financing Scheme (SFS).
- (v) The scheme will be applicable for the complete duration of the course.
- (vi) Orphans will upload the Death Certificate of parent/single earning parent/adopted parents clearly mentioning it to be COVID-19 related death.
- (vii) The students already admitted to a course may also request for support through concerned Chairperson/Director/Principal of the University Teaching Department/Institute. These cases will be considered separately.

- 12.1 The University has 25 hostels (11 for boys, 1 for foreign male students and 13 for girls students). The accommodation in the hostels is provided strictly on the basis of department merit list of admissions; and in accordance with limited number of seats in hostels allocated by the Chief Wardens to each department with reservations (20% for SC category, 3% for Differently Abled-Blind/disabled with 70%). Subletting of hostel accommodation is strictly prohibited. Both the subletters and sublettees are liable to be expelled from the hostel. Students willing to seek hostel accommodation are advised to refer to the Hostel Rules & Regulations Booklet available with the Manager, Printing & Publications of the University on payment of prescribed price. Any hosteler desirous of possessing vehicle in the Hostel shall have to submit an attested photocopy of Registration Certificate (RC) of the vehicle along with Driving License in the office of the Warden of the respective Hostel. If the hostel authorities are not satisfied with the character/past behavior/antecedents of a student, Hostel accommodation may be refused to him/her in order to ensure discipline and peaceful atmosphere of the hostels. Keeping in view the limited number of rooms/seats, the hostel accommodation is allotted on sharing basis. All terms and conditions for seeking hostel accommodation are given in the Hostel Rules and Regulations Booklet which may be consulted accordingly.
- 12.2 Admission in the hostels will be through online mode. Students seeking admission in the hostles will be required to apply through IUMS Portal for hostel accommodation and upload the proof of residence viz. Adhar Card/Ration Card/Passport at the time of applying for admission.
- 12.3 The hostel room allotment will be through online mode and students will deposit the hostel fee online. Students will be allowed to stay in the University hostels as per academic schedule for the session.
- 12.4 Due to paucity of hostel accommodation, the University may not be in a position to accommodate all the aspirants in the hostels.
- Due to paucity of hostel accommodation, the University may not make available accommodation to the students to be admitted in Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma and P.G. Diploma programmes in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes for the session 2023-24. They will be required to make their own boarding and lodging arrangements outside the Campus.
- 12.6 The priority for hostel allotment will be given to the candidates who have not completed P.G. programmes as a regular student from the University Campus in past years. Admission to hostels, for those candidates, who have already completed one P.G. programme as a regular student from the University Campus and take admission in second PG programme on University Campus, will be given only after the permission of proctor and the concerned Chief Warden.

Kurukshetra University Golden Jubilee Post-graduate Scholarships to be awarded to 90 students of P.G. programmes of the University Teaching Departments/(except SFS programmes) @ Rs. 500/- p.m. for 10 months every year, 45 Scholarships for 1st& 2nd Semester and 45 Scholarships for 3rd& 4th Semester students will be awarded to Below Poverty Line (BPL)/Poor/Needy and deserving students having atleast 2nd division at graduation level. In addition to this, there are some other Scholarships/ Stipends, State Scholarships and Scholarships/Awards, donated by individuals/ institutes are awarded by the University for various programmes. Notifications in this regard are circulated in all the University Teaching Departments. Students are advised to visit Department/Institute notice board regularly.

"Smt. Kiran Yadav Scholarship"

There shall be one Scholarship of Rs. 1,000/- p.m. known as "Smt. Kiran Yadav Scholarship" every year to a student doing B.Ed. Special Education (Visual Impairment) in the Department of Education who is resident of Haryana and fulfills one of the following eligibility criteria:

- (i) Physically Challenged/Differently able.
- (ii) Widow/Divorcee Woman
- (iii) Ward of a Marginalized farmer
- (iv) Ward of a Martyr in Defence
- (v) BPL Card Holder

The following criteria in order of preference/priority will also be considered for award of this scholarship:

- a) Economically Backward (having lowest income per annum from all the sources).
- b) In case of tie, Merit of qualifying examination will be considered.

CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING

Ragging is totally prohibited in the University and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 and "The Haryana Prohibition of Ragging in Educational Institution Ordinance, 2012" as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.

We appreciate the parents and the students for their interest and option towards pursuing their higher studies at Kurukshetra University. We wish them success in their plans towards getting admission in the programme of their choice on the campus. Those who succeed in joining a programme, should be making best use of the excellent facilities and congenial atmosphere available in the University towards all-round development of their personality. We would expect our students to make best use of this opportunity and grow as able and responsible citizens. Students will be required to work hard with their energies focused towards achieving their goal.

We take pride in informing all those desirous of seeking admission, that over all these years, our University has the best traditions of maintaining a healthy and congenial academic environment. We are also glad to convey that with the determined and sincere efforts of our senior students and faculty, our campus has been free from the menace of Ragging.

Chairpersons/Directors of all the University Teaching Departments/Institutes to ensure that every student and their parents be asked to submit an online undertaking every academic year to the effect that the concerned student will not take part in any activity leading to Ragging of junior students.

What Constitutes Ragging

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary programme do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;

- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it : sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- j. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of color, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
- k. All the senior students are advised to guide and treat junior students affectionately.
- 1. Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other University functionaries like Proctor, Dean Students Welfare, Chief Warden, Wardens or Chief Security Officer for help and guidance.

BONAFIDE RESIDENTS OF HARYANA - GUIDELINES REGARDING

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011-6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

- 1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/ medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-
 - (i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
 - (ii) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents: -
 - (a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - (b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
 - (iii) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
 - (iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
 - (v) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - (vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - (vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
 - (a) Citizen of India;
 - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
 - (viii) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognised by Govt. of Haryana.
- 2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or

- in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
- 3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/ Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
- 4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
- 5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/ medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.

I am directed to invite your kind attention to the State Government instruction no. 8/96-3GS-III dated 25.06.1997 wherein it is observed that the Scheduled Castes/Backward asses candidates who get selected in Govt. job in the open competition on the basis of general merit (without availing any relaxation of age etc.) will have to be counted against general seats as are open competition candidates. They will not be considered against reserved seats. However, ich candidates should fulfill conditions of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for the General category candidates.

Hence, this department being a Nodal agency of the Government for implementation Whe reservation policy issue this clarification that Government Department must follow the above instruction dated 25.06.1997. These instructions were issued in connection with the reservation Sylvapolicy pertaining to Govt. job. On the same analogy; the Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected/admitted in Education 17. candidates who get selected/admitted in Educational/Professional/Technical Institution and Universities in the open competition on the basis of their own merit, they will not be counted against the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Government Notification bearing No. Leg.15/2020, dated 15.05.2020 vide which an Act namly, the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institution) Act, 2020 was enacted by the State Government. In this Act under Section 3 and 6 following provisions have been made:-

- Section 3. (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.
- Fifty per cent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Caste as enumerated in the Annexure.
- A person belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes shall, Section 6. for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste indentification issued by the ecompetent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.
- In this Act, 36 Castes were included in the list of Deprived Scheduled Castes 2. at Annexure to this Act. For proper implementation of this Act, all the authorites competent to issue Caste Certificate are directed to mention clearly that the Certificate is of 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' or 'Scheduled Caste' so that at the time of admission the Institutions may find out easily as to how many candidates applied

Subject: Regarding the issue of Caste Certificates (including certificates for Scheduled Caste, Deprived Scheduled Caste, Backward Class, Other Backward Class, Tapriwas, Vimukat Jati, and Nomadic Tribe) through SARAL portal.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your attention to Government instruction No. 22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 21.03.2014 regarding issuance of caste certificate wherein various competent authorities to verify and issue caste certificates were notified along with other terms & conditions and formats of the caste certificates.

- The Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021, provides for the assignment of the Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a unique identifier number to each family. The database, namely Family Information Data Repository (FIDR), contains PPN along with corresponding information generally required for determining eligibility for, or the provision of any scheme, service, subsidy or benefit provided/implemented by or on behalf of the State Government/any Government agency/local authority. State Government has been empowered under section 8 of the Act to prescribe Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a requirement for the purpose of determining above mentioned eligibility or provision. The verified information linked with PPN available in Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) has now made it feasible to issue Caste Certificates over the counter through the SARAL portal.
- In view of the above, Government has decided to issue revised instructions/guidelines 3. in supersession of all the previous instructions issued till now, as under:-
 - Portal for the Issue of Caste Certificate.-The Caste Certificate shall now be issued to eligible residents of Haryana based on PPN through the SARAL portal (https://saralharyana.gov.in/) facsimile signed by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner-cum-District Citizen Resources Information Officer) or Head of the Department/Organisation, as the case may be. These caste certificates shall include :-

- a) Scheduled Caste certificate
- b) Deprived Scheduled Caste certificate
- c) Backward Class certificate
- d) Other Backward Class certificate
- e) Tapriwas Caste certificate
- f) Vimukt Jati (Denotified Tribes) certificate
- g) Nomadic Tribes certificate

These certificates will be issued on the basis of verified data on caste and income contained in the FIDR. The Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for issuing Caste Certificates along with the formats of Caste Certificates shall be issued by the Citizen Resources Information Department.

(ii) Person who is entitled to obtain a Caste Certificate.—

Following persons are entitled to obtain a Caste Certificate:-

- (a) A person who is a resident of State of Haryana by birth; or
- (b) A male person (including his children) who is an employee in the service of Haryana Government or any of its Boards/ Corporations/ Statutory Authorities/ Universities etc. provided he belongs to any of the notified castes/tribes by birth; and
- (c) A female person who is an employee in the service of Haryana Government or any of its Boards/ Corporations/ Statutory Authorities/ Universities etc. provided she belongs to any of the notified castes/tribes by birth.
- Note.— A child born at a place outside Haryana shall also be eligible to obtain caste certificate from Haryana provided his father has been issued Caste Certificate by the competent authority as per provision in the instructions of Haryana Government. However, a child born in Haryana State shall not be eligible to get caste certificate on basis of birth-place/birth certificate of Haryana, if his father has been issued Caste Certificate by a State other than Haryana.

(iii) Caste Certificate in cases of Migration.-

Where a person migrates from one State to another, he can claim to belong to a notified caste only in relation to the State to which he originally belonged and not in respect of the State to which he has migrated.

(iv) Caste Certificate to person who claims through Marriage.—

No person who is not a member of a notified caste/tribe by birth will be deemed to be a member of that notified caste/tribe merely because he or she had married a person belonging to that notified caste/tribe. On the other hand a person who is a member of a notified caste/tribe will continue to be a member of that notified caste/tribe even after his or her marriage with a person who does not belong to a notified caste/tribe.

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(v) Caste Certificate in case of Adoption of child.—

Great care has to be exercised in dealing with cases where a person claims to be a member of a notified caste/tribe on the ground that he/she has been adopted by a person of that notified caste/tribe. The validity of the adoption has to be clearly established before any caste certificate can be given. It is for the party to prove his/her claim by cogent and reliable evidence:

- (a) While deciding whether an adoption is valid, the certificate issuing authority should satisfy himself that all the requirements of law have been complied with. He should also take into account the behaviour of the child after adoption whether he physically lives with and is supported by his adoptive parents and receives no financial help from his original parents. In case these conditions are not satisfied, the certificate should be refused.
- (b) In addition, it should be verified that all other conditions for a valid adoption, including the physical transfer of the adopted person to the family of the adoptive parents and that he has severed all ties with the original parents are fulfilled.
- (c) Further, in case of a person who is a Hindu, Buddhist or Sikh or any other person governed by the Hindu Adoptions and Maintenance Act, 1856 (78 of 1956), the requirements of valid adoption are given in Sections 6 to 11 of the Hindu Adoptions and Maintenance Act, 1856 (78 of 1956) as amended from time to time. The actual giving and taking of the child in adoption is a mandatory requirement and thereafter the adopted child is deemed to be the child of his or her adoptive father or mother for all purposes and the child severs all ties with the family of his or her birth. Ordinarily, no child who has attained the age of 15 years or who is married can be given in adoption unless there is a custom or usage applicable to the parties.
- (d) Where the case relates to an adoption in case of a Hindu, Buddhist or Sikh or any other person governed by the Hindu Adoptions and Maintenance Act, 1956 (78 of 1956), who is married or of the age of 15 years and above, the certificate shall be required to be given by the District Magistrate who shall, after making due enquiries as to the validity of the adoption and as to whether such adoption is permitted by a custom or usage applicable to the parties, make an endorsement to that effect on the certificate. Such custom or usage should have been continuously and uniformly observed for a long time and obtained the force of law among the Hindus of that particular area, or that community, group or family provided that the custom or usage is certain and not unreasonable or opposed to public policy and in the case of custom or

usage in respect of a particular family, that the custom or usage has not been discontinued.

(vi) Caste Certificate in case of Conversion and Reconversion of religion by a Scheduled Caste person.—

- (a) Where a Scheduled Caste person gets converted to a religion other than Hinduism or Sikhism or Buddhism and then reconverts himself back to Hinduism or Sikhism or Buddhism, he will be deemed to have reverted to his original Scheduled Caste, if he is accepted by the members of that particular caste as one among them.
- (b) In the case of a descendant of a Scheduled Caste convert, the mere fact of conversion to Hinduism or Sikhism or Buddhism will not be sufficient to entitle him to be regarded as a member of the Scheduled Caste to which his forefathers belonged. It will have to be established that such a convert has been accepted by the members of the caste claimed as one among themselves and has thus become a member of that caste.

(vii) Determination/Verification of Caste of a person.—

The determination/verification of the caste of a person shall be done strictly in accordance with the notifications of the Government of India in case of Scheduled Castes and Other Backward Classes; and in accordance with notifications of the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana in case of Deprived Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes, De-notified Tribes (Vimukt Jatis and Tapriwas Jatis) and Nomadic Tribes.

(viii) Verification when a person claims of Caste by birth.—

Where a person claims to belong to a Scheduled Caste, Deprived Scheduled Caste, Other Backward Class, Backward Class, De-notified Tribe (Virnukt Jatis and Tapriwas Jatis) or Nomadic Tribe by birth, it should be verified:

- (i) That the person and his/her parents actually belong to the community claimed;
- (ii) That this community is included in the Presidential Orders specifying the Scheduled Castes in relation to the concerned State; or is notified as Other Backward Class by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India; or notified as Deprived Scheduled Caste, Backward Class, De-notified Tribe (Vimukt Jatis and Tapriwas Jatis) or Nomadic Tribe by the Government of Haryana.
- (iii) That the person belongs to that State in respect of which the community has been scheduled/notified.

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- (vi) If the person claims to be a Scheduled Caste or Deprived Scheduled Caste, he should profess Hinduism or Sikhism or Buddhism religion.
- (v) A person claiming to belong to a Backward Class, Other Backward Class, Denotified Tribe or Nomadic Tribe may profess any religion.

(ix) Authorities competent to verify the caste.—

The following authorities will now be competent to verify the caste of person who is a resident of State of Haryana:

1.	A resident of any Rural area in the State	Designated Officers notified by Citizen Resources Information Department
2.	A resident of any Urban area in the State (Municipal Committee / Municipal Council/ Municipal Corporation)	Designated Officers notified by
3.	A male employee (including his children) serving on regular basis in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana in any Department/ PSU / Statutory Authority/ University, etc.	As per record available in Human Resource Management System (HRMS)
4	A female employee serving on regular basis in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana in any Department/ PSU/ Statutory Authority/ University, etc.	As per record available in Human Resource Management System (HRMS)

Government has also decided that in case of issuance of wrong caste certificate carelessly or deliberately without proper care or verification, action would be taken against the concerned official/s under the relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code in addition to the action under the appropriate disciplinary rules applicable to them.

(x) Online Service for verification of Caste based on PPN.—

Residents seeking to verify their caste in PPN may visit https://meraparivar.haryana.gov.in/ReportGrievance portal. Once the request for verification of caste category and/or caste is made by the resident on this portal, designated officers will verify and mark the same as verified in the FIDR for the resident.

(xi) Clarification in case of doubt.—

In case of any doubt regarding caste/tribe of a person, the malter will be referred to the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department of the State of Haryana, and the clarifications given by the said Department alone shall be valid.

(xII) Competent Authorities for Issuance of Caste Certificate.—

Caste certificates shall be issued on provision of PPN through SARAL portal https://saralharyana.gov.in/ to eligible residents of Haryana by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner-cum-District Citizen Resources Information Officer) through his facsimile signature on the certificate and to the employees of the State of Haryana by the Head of the Department/Organization concerned through his facsimile signature on the certificate.

(xiii) Validity of a Caste Certificate.—

- (i) A Caste Certificate once issued (in its standard format) shall be valid for the life-time of the person so long as such caste/tribe is not removed or modified in the notifications issued by the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana.
- (ii) Where a Caste Certificate is requested for specific use outside the context of Government of Haryana, it shall be issued in the format prescribed by the Government of India.
- (iii) Certificates which include income and/or assets based information like creamy layer criteria shall become invalid after the validity period prescribed on the said certificate. Such certificates shall be valid for the current financial year, i.e. till coming 31st March (included) from the date it has been issued.
- (iv) A Caste Certificate may also become invalid if after due process, it has been concluded that the caste was incorrectly mentioned on the certificate or wrongly verified in the FIDR, due to any reason whatsoever.

(xiv) Grievance Redressal and Correction Process.—

If an applicant is not in agreement with his caste category/caste contained in the FIDR, then he/she may lodge his/her grievance for correction on the Grievance Module of the Parivar Pehchan Number portal https://meraparivar.haryana.gov.in/ReportGrievance.

(xv) General Terms and Conditions.-

- (a) The Caste Certificate is usable without any restriction wherever it is accepted (i.e., subject to the criteria laid down by the entity accepting the certificate) and hence no usage/applicability restrictions shall be mentioned on the certificate.
- (b) From the effective date of this order, only the caste certificates issued through SARAL portal in the formats prescribed by the Citizen Resources Information

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Department based on PPN and corresponding verified data contained in the FIDR shall be valid caste certificates.

- (c) A Caste Certificate obtained by means of any fraud, misrepresentation or concealment of facts or by some other illegal means shall be declared as invalid and the benefit availed by the candidate/applicant shall be withdrawn and legal action including criminal case will be initiated against the applicant for misrepresenting the facts and playing fraud, as well as against the officials/authorized persons for incorrect/ wrong verification by collusion or otherwise. In such an event, the caste and caste category shall be marked as NOT VERIFIED in the FIDR.
- (d) Mere issuance of a Caste certificate does not entitle a person holding such certificate to any benefit that may be admissible under various Government Schemes implemented from time to time. Hence, it is important that the authority concerned examines the applicant's entitlement to any specific benefit in accordance with the instructions on the subject at any given point of time. For instance, a person from the Backward Class may not be entitled to certain benefits if he falls within the creamy layer as defined from time to time. Accordingly, the Caste Certificates shall address ONLY the caste of the certificate holder. Other eligibility criteria for a particular scheme shall be addressed separately by the authority extending any such benefit.
- (e) All Haryana Government organisations (including Departments, Educational Institutions, Boards, Corporations and Societies) are required to accept the Caste Certificate in its standard format prescribed by the Citizen Resources Information Department from time to time.
